The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to Her Royal Highness.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

1. The landing of sheep, goats, and swine at a Foreign Animals Wharf under the provisions of Chapter II of The Foreign Animals Order of 1884 is subject to the following condition (namely),—

That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within one week before, nor at any time since, taking them on board, entered any port from which the landing of sheep, goats, and swine in England and Wales and Scotland is for the time being prohibited.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the hamlet of Wildhern, in the borough of Andover, in the county of Southampton,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, March 2, 1885.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin, dated the 21st ultimo, reporting as to the proceedings of the German Reichstag, with reference to the Bill now before it for altering the Customs tariff of the Empire.

Sir E. Malet reports that (a) the duty of 3 marks per 100 kilos on wheat has been finally passed; (b) the duty on rye has been raised to 3 marks per 100 kilos; (c) the duty on barley has been fixed at 1 mark per 100 kilos; and (d) the existing duty on Indian corn is retained.

The Despatch further states that—"in the case of countries enjoying by treaty most-favoured-nation treatment, the practical application of the higher duties on rye has for the next two years been stopped by the provisions of the German and Spanish Commercial Treaty, and can therefore only be at present enforced against Russia and Denmark.

"Simultaneously with the second reading of the new corn duties, a law was passed, bearing date the 20th instant, empowering the Imperial Chancellor to issue a provisional measure, imposing the new duties at once in cases where the contracts for delivery were executed after the 15th January, 1885. A notice to this effect has already been published in the Gazette, and any consignments claiming to be admitted to Germany under the old duties will have to be accompanied by properly attested Consular certificates that the contracts for their delivery were signed before the aforesaid date.

"In the case of rye similar certificates will be required to prove that the country of origin was one entitling it to most-favoured-nation treatment."
