And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church of the said parish of Warburton, or of or belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof to the said new church of Saint Werburg (now being by virtue of these presents, the parish church of the said parish of Warburton), and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.
