A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS by the Army Act, 1881, and the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that, in case of imminent national danger, or of great emergency, the occasion being first communicated to Parliament, if Parliament be then sitting, or declared by Proclamation, it shall be lawful for Us by Proclamation to direct that the Reserve Force and the Militia Reserve Force, or such part thereof as We may from time to time think fit, may be called out on Permanent Service; and by any such Proclamation to order a Secretary of State, from time to time, to give such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out the Forces mentioned in such Proclamation, or all or any of the men belonging thereto, and that upon the issuing of any such Proclamation the men in Class I of the Reserve Force, and of the Militia Reserve Force, or those of them to whom such Proclamation applies shall become subject to general service with Our Army, and the said Force, or such part thereof as may be so called out, shall serve in pursuance of such Proclamation until it be signified to them by Our command that their services are no longer required; but so, nevertheless, that they shall not be required under such Proclamation to serve for a period exceeding in the whole the remainder unexpired of their respective terms of service in the Reserve Force to which they severally belong and any further period not exceeding twelve months during which as soldiers of the Regular Forces they can, under Section 87 of the Army Act, 1881, be detained in service after the time at which they would otherwise be entitled to be discharged:

And, also, that We may direct that all or any persons who would otherwise be entitled, in pursuance of the terms of their enlistment, to be transferred to the Reserve, shall continue in Army Service, and such persons shall accordingly continue to serve in Army Service for the same period for which they might be required to serve if they had been transferred to the Reserve and called out for permanent service by a Proclamation issued by Us under the enactments relating to the Reserve.

And whereas the present state of public affairs and the extent of the demands on Our Military Forces for the protection of the interests of the Empire, have, in Our opinion, constituted a case

of great emergency within the meaning of the said Acts, and We have communicated the same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, We do, in pursuance of the said Acts, hereby direct the Right Honourable Spencer Compton Cavendish (commonly called the Marquis of Hartington), one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to call out on permanent service from time to time, such men of Our Reserve Force and such men of the Militia Reserve Force as he may think fit; and such men shall proceed to and attend at such places and at such times as may be respectively appointed by Our Secretary of State to serve as part of Our Army until their services are no longer required.

And We further direct that all soldiers who, on and after this date, would otherwise be entitled, in pursuance of the terms of their enlistment, to be transferred to the Reserve, shall continue in Army service until legally discharged or transferred to the Army Reserve.

And We do hereby direct Our said Secretary of State to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty-sixth day of March, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

A DESPATCH, of which the following is a copy, has been received by the Secretary of State for War from General Lord Wolseley, G.C.B., G.C.M.G. :-

My LORD, Camp, Korti, March 1, 1885.

I HAVE the honour to forward herewith copies of two Despatches received from Major-General Sir Redvers Buller, K.C.M.G. They contain an account of the attack of the enemy on his camp at Abu Klea wells on the 16th and 17th ultimo, and also of his march to Gakdul, where he arrived on the 26th.

The manner in which the movement from Goubat to Gakdul has been carried out reflects the greatest credit upon General Buller as a leader and upon all ranks under him. Every retrograde step is regarded by uncivilized races as a sign of weakness and of fear, and to withdraw troops in the face of a savage enemy is neither an easy nor a grateful task. Sir Redvers Buller has, however, done this with little loss, and in a way which has won him the confidence of all who served under him.

CHIEF OF THE STAFF,

IN continuation of my last, I have to report, that shortly before dusk the enemy, on the 16th, occupied a hill commanding the camp, and distant about 1,200 yards from it. From this position they kept up a constant fire all night upon our position.

I attach a return of our killed and wounded. The wounded are all doing well.

On the 17th we drove the enemy away from their position with some loss, as they were seen to carry several bodies away, and left six dead behind them. I have now established a post up on the hill, and anticipate no further annoyance.

I am much indebted to Major Wardrop, Deputy-Assistant Adjutant-General, for his services. He threatened the enemy's rear with a party of only three other mounted men and Lieutenant Tudway, Mounted Infantry, and by appearing himself at several points, and firing rapidly, made them believe that what was really a very strong position was threatened in rear, and they consequently evacuated it.

CHIEF OF THE STAFF,

1. I LEFT Abu Klea on the 23rd instant, and arrived here with the whole force about noon to-day.

2. About 11 A.M. on the 23rd the enemy received a strong reinforcement which was estimated to be not less than 8,000 men.

3. At 2 P.M. I sent out all my baggage with a convoy of 300 men, under Colonel Stanley Clarke, with instructions to camp on the Oh Mit Handel plain, out of gunshot range of the Abu Klea hills.

4. At 6.40 P.M. I withdrew the garrisons of my outposts, and at 7.30 P.M. marched out of Abu Klea; we were not interfered with.

5. The enemy's scouts turned up about midday on the 24th, and fired a few shots, they then retired, and we have seen nothing of them since.

6. Having barely camels to move my stores and supplies all the men and officers had to march; this, in this weather, on three quarts of water per man per day, was most exhausting, but nothing could have been better than the spirit shown by all ranks.

7. I attach a state. We brought in here 32 all ranks sick and wounded; all the wounded have done well on this march.

8. I wish expressly to remark on the very excellent work that has been done by the small detachment of the 19th Hussars, both during our occupation of Abu Klea and during our retirement. Each man has done the work of ten, and

it is not too much to say that the force owes much to Major Trench and his 13 troopers.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.
