

<p>CRAVEN PARK, Harlesden.</p>	<p>Two Carriages. At the apex of Craven Park and Harrow Roads, Harlesden ; horses' heads towards the North-east and rear of hind Carriage close to the kerb.</p>
<p>STAPLETON HALL ROAD, Stroud Green.</p>	<p>Six Carriages. To commence at North side of Great Northern Railway Arch in Stapleton Hall Road, parish of Hornsey, and extend Southward along West side of carriage way close to the kerb, a sufficient distance for Six Hackney Carriages to stand.</p>

**SIXTEEN STANDINGS CANCELLED.**

<p>MARYLEBONE ROAD ...</p>	<p>Eight Carriages. In the centre of the Marylebone Road, commencing twenty yards East of the crossing from York Place to Upper Baker Street, and extending Eastward as far as necessary for Eight Hackney Carriages to stand. Six of the horses' heads towards the East, and two towards the West.</p>
<p>KINGSLAND HIGH STREET ...</p>	<p>Two Carriages. Commencing in Kingsland High Street, with horses' heads eighty feet from Balls Pond Road, and extending along the kerbstone on West side as far as necessary for two carriages.</p>
<p>HIGH STREET, Forest Hill.</p>	<p>Three Carriages. Commencing twelve feet from North-east corner of High Street, Forest Hill, extending along the kerb on East side towards Upper Sydenham.</p>
<p>THURLOW PARK ROAD, Dulwich.</p>	<p>Six Carriages. On the South side of Thurlow Park Road, Dulwich, Three on the East side and Three on the West side of the Railway Bridges.</p>
<p>ETON ROAD, Haverstock Hill.</p>	<p>Three Carriages. Commencing ten feet from the College Road, Haverstock Hill, extending along centre of Eton Road towards Provost Road ; horses' heads towards Haverstock Hill.</p>
<p>STATION ROAD, Kilburn.</p>	<p>Twelve Carriages. Commencing at South-west corner of Station Road (now Belsize Road), Kilburn, extending Eastwards along South side of Station Road (now Belsize Road).</p>
<p>SOUTH HILL PARK ROAD ...</p>	<p>Six Carriages. Commencing at the South-west corner of South Hill Park Road (now Parliament Hill Road) adjoining Hampstead Heath Railway Station, extending along kerb ; horses' head towards South End Road.</p>
<p>HAVERSTOCK HILL ...</p>	<p>Eight Carriages. Commencing at South-west corner of Belsize Lane and Haverstock Hill, continuing along West side of Haverstock Hill to Ornan Road.</p>
<p>FULHAM ROAD ...</p>	<p>Seven Carriages. In the Fulham Road to commence on the South side of the said road by Unity Place, and extend along by the kerbstone in front of St. George's Workhouse in a Westerly direction. Not more than two cabs to stand to the East of the public urinal, both of which cabs are to keep well clear of the Eastern entrance gate to the Saint George's Workhouse.</p>
<p>RED COW LANE ...</p>	<p>Ten Carriages. Commencing at the Red Cow Lane on the South side of the Hammersmith Road, and extending Eastward along the kerbstone as far as necessary.</p>
