

HIGH STREET, Kensington	Two Carriages. Appointed on the 29th day of June, 1869, in High Street, Kensington, on the North side thereof, opposite the church.
BEADON ROAD, Hammersmith	Eight Carriages. Appointed on 22nd November, 1881, in the Beadon Road, Hammersmith, commencing at the South-east corner of the said road, and extending by the kerbstone in a North-easterly direction as far as may be necessary, for Eight Hackney Carriages to stand.
KNIGHT'S HILL, Lower Norwood	Six Carriages. Commencing opposite the Jews' Hospital, and extending along the West side of Knight's Hill, opposite the Lower Norwood Railway Station.
CARLTON TERRACE, Harrow Road.	Eight Carriages. At Carlton Terrace, Harrow Road, Paddington, commencing ten feet from the crossing at Harrow Road and extending along the kerb on West side sufficiently far for eight carriages. Horses' heads towards Harrow Road.
HAVEN GREEN, Ealing.	Twelve Carriages. On the North side of Ealing Railway Station, to commence at the South-west corner of New-road on Haven Green, twenty-seven yards from the Station; extending Northward along the road eighty-four yards. Horses' heads facing Southwards.
CRAVEN PARK ROAD, Harlesden.	Two Carriages. At Craven Park Road, Harlesden, to commence four yards from the junction of Old Harrow Road, and extend northwards along the North side of Craven Park Road as far as necessary for two Hackney Carriages; horses' heads facing Old Harrow Road.

Metropolitan Board of Works.

AT a Meeting of the Board at their Office, Spring-gardens, Charing Cross, this 9th day of January, 1885, amongst the Orders is as follows:—

Metropolis Management Act, 1855; Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862; Division of the Parish of St. Leonard Bromley into Wards.

WHEREAS by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, Section 41, it is enacted: that "When at any time upon any account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament any of the parishes within the Metropolis not now divided into wards for the purpose of electing vestrymen shall be found to contain more than two thousand rated householders, it shall be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application in writing of the vestry or of not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine, and set out the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders; and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall, in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward, have regard as far as in their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three."

And whereas the parish of St. Leonard Bromley is within the limits of the Metropolis as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and

is one of the parishes in Part I of Schedule B of that Act, and at the passing of the same Act the parish was not divided into wards.

And whereas not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish of St. Leonard Bromley have applied to us, the Metropolitan Board of Works, to divide the said parish into wards pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862.

And whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament that the said parish contains eight thousand one hundred and ten rated householders, and that the number of inhabited houses in the parish is returned at eight thousand two hundred and forty-one, and the rateable annual value of property at two hundred and three thousand six hundred and eighty pounds. Now the Metropolitan Board of Works, having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament as contained in the census return for the year 1881, that the number of rated householders for the parish of St. Leonard Bromley is eight thousand one hundred and ten, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the same parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of St. Leonard Bromley be divided into three wards to be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the undermentioned schedule, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said schedule.
