Southwark and Vauxhall Water.

(Application to Parliament to sanction Alteration of Site of Service Reservoir, partly in the Parish of St. Giles, Camberwell, in the county of Surrey, and partly in the Parish of Lewisham, in the county of Kent, shown on the Plans deposited in November last; and also Alter-

ation of the course of part of the Line of Pipes No. 1, shown on the same Plans).

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Southwark and Vauxhall Water Company (who are herein referred to as "the Company") are applying to Parliament in the present session for leave to introduce into the Southwark and Vauxhall Water Bill, now pending in the House of Lords, all necessary provisions for enabling the Company to make and maintain, in lieu of the service reservoir partly in the parish of St. Giles, Camberwell, in the county of Surrey, and partly in the parish of Lewisham, in the county of Kent, described in clause 5 of the Bill, and shown upon the plans deposited in November last, and in lieu of the line of pipes No. 1 in the said parish of Lewisham, also described in clause 5 of the Bill, and shown upon the plans deposited in November last, the following reservoir and other works connected therewith:—

1. To make and maintain a service reservoir, (substituted service reservoir), wholly in the parish of Lewisham, in the county of Kent, which substituted service reservoir will have a superficial area of 2,500 square yards, or thereabouts, and will be situate on certain lands numbered respectively 666 and 667 in the parish of Lewisham aforesaid, on the 25-inch ordnance map of the county of Kent. The said substituted service reservoir will be situated at the western end of the property numbered on the plans deposited in the month of November last 2 in the parish of Lewisham.

2. To make and maintain an aqueduct or main pipe (substituted line of pipes No. 1), commencing on the northern side of the said intended substituted service reservoir, in the said parish of Lewisham and county of Kent, passing through the property called or known by the name of Barr Beacon, into the Canonbie-road, and along that road to its junction with the Honor Oak-road, and terminating in the said Honor Oak-road, at a point in that road opposite the boundary-post indicating the boundary between the parish of St. Giles, Camberwell, and the parish of Lewisham.

3. It is intended to extend to the said substituted reservoir, line of pipes, and works such of the powers and provisions contained in the pending Bill, with respect to the works therein defined, as may be applicable to the new or substituted works.

Duplicate plans and sections showing the line and levels of the proposed substituted works, together with a book of reference to such plans, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of the lands to be taken for the purposes of the said works, and also a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette will, on or before the 15th day of April instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and book of reference as relates to the parish of Lewisham, in or through which the said substituted works will be made or situate, together with a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette will be deposited with the parish clerk of such parish, at his residence.
