Tunic.—Blue cloth, single breasted, stand collar with hook and eye at neck, five coat sized

buttons up front, edges stitched. The sleeves laced as in undress uniform, omitting the notched holes and buttons. Pockets across the skirt opposite the lower button, without flaps, and an outside left breast pocket with a welt. An opening at bottom of each side seam five inches long.

White Tuni:.—Cotton drill, with the pockets patched, same shape and make as the blue cloth tunic. The stripes on the sleeves to be of white silk lace, with the distinguishing colours between the stripes for Officers of the Civil Branch.
