DESPATCH, of which the following is a A copy, has been received by the Secretary of State for War from General Lord Wolseley, G.C.B., G.C.M.G.:-

Camp Korti,

March 16, 1885. My Lord,

I HAVE the honour to forward herewith the report by Captain Lord Charles Beresford, R.N., of the proceedings of the Naval Brigade under his command, and to request that you will be so good as to cause the same to be forwarded for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

In a previous despatch I have drawn attention to the admirable service rendered by Lord Charles Beresford and the officers and men under him. I cannot speak too highly of the manner in which they have all done their work, nor too strongly of the value of that work to the Expedition. I trust that your Lordship may see fit to bring their excellent conduct on all occasions under the notice of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Report of Proceedings of Naval Brigade from November 26 last to March 8, 1885.

Korti, March 10, 1885. I HAVE the honour to report the proceedings

of the Naval Brigade from November 26 last, the day on which I was appointed to take command.

November 26, 1884, to January 5, 1885, the men forming the Naval Brigade were employed on various duties on different parts of the river.

5 January. The 1st Division under the command of Lieutenant A. Pigott arrived at Korti, I myself arriving from Dal, where I had

been employed on duty.

8 January. The 1st Division left Korti in the column commanded by Brigadier-General Sir Herbert Stewart.

12 January. Arrived at Gakdul.

14 January. Left Gakdul with column.16 January. In the afternoon we first had touch with the enemy, the Hussar scouts reporting them to be in considerable numbers about 4 miles ahead of the column, which position was 4 or 5 miles distant from Abou-Klea Wells.

The General formed a Zareba for the night. Camels inside, men outside between them and Zareba.

The Naval Brigade were posted with their Gardner on the flank. During that night a continuous and annoying rifle fire was kept up on the Zareba by riflemen from hills on the right flank, distant about 800 yards.

As the morning dawned this fire increased. There were no casualties in the Naval Brigade. 17th January, after breakfast, at 6 A.M., the force was formed up for receiving an attack outside the Zareba, the Artillery (half battery 7-pr. screw guns) and Naval Brigade with the Gardner gun taking position on the right front. The fire from the enemy's riflemen increased considerably during this period.

Shortly after 9 A.M. the General, having waited for presumed attack, ordered the square to be formed on a clear space, about 400 yards in front of the Zareba. I was directed to place the Gardner gun in the centre of the rear face, keeping it in a line with men marching; but if the square was attacked from the front, or on either of the flanks, I was to use my own judg-ment as to the best place for the gun. The square advanced under a very hot fire, from the left flank, for about 2 miles, as we cleared a hill on our left flank, flags of different devices, numbering nearly 100, were seen attached to poles planted in the ground amongst the grass, which was high. The edge of the grass, from the flank of the square, was about 400 yards distant, the flags about 700 yards. Not one of the enemy was visible in the grass at this moment. The square halted when abreast the flags, and immediately the enemy, to the number of about 6,000, sprang up from the vicinity of the flags, and formed a V-shaped column with the apex towards the square. They were accompanied by about 40 horsemen, who all carried flags, and came on at a hand gallop; the footmen, who carried spears, swords, or axes, kept pace with them, however.

Immediately I perceived the enemy coming down, I ran the gun from its position in the rear face of the square to a position in the centre of the left flank, about five paces out from the square, and at once commenced firing. After firing about 40 rounds, or eight turns of the lever, I perceived by where the enemy were falling, that the gun had too much elevation, so I gave the order "Cease firing," to alter the elevation. In a moment this was effected, and we had again commenced firing on the front ranks of the enemy with the most excellent results, when, after about 30 rounds, the gun jammed.

The enemy were then about 200 yards from

the muzzle of the gun.

The Captain of the gun, Will Rhoods, chief boatswain mate, and myself, unscrewed the plate to clear the barrel, or take the lock of the jammed barrel out, when the enemy were

upon us.

Rhoods was killed with a spear. Miller, armourer, I also saw killed with a spear at the same moment on my left. I was knocked down in the rear of the gun, but uninjured, except a small spear scratch on the left hand. The crowd and crush of the enemy was very great at this point, and, as I struggled up, I was carried against the face of the square, which was literally pressed back by sheer weight of numbers about 12 paces from the position of the gun. The crush was so great, that at the moment few on either side were killed, but fortunately this flank of the square had been forced up a very steep little mound, which enabled the rear rank to open a tremendous fire over the heads of the front rank men; this relieved the pressure and enabled the front rank to bayonet or shoot those of the enemy nearest them. The enemy then, for some reason, turned to their right along the left flank of the square, and streamed away in numbers along the rear face of it, where I afterwards heard they effected an entrance.

None of them got into the square at the place I indicated where the crush was, which was held by the Mounted Infantry. In a very few minutes the terrific fire from the square told on the enemy. There was a momentary waver, and they then walked quietly away. I immediately manned the Gardner, cleared the jam as soon as This, however, was not done in time to be of much use in firing on the slowly retreating enemy, as they had got back into the nullah and behind the mound before it was

After falling in the Brigade, which numbered 40 at the commencement of the action (the remainder having been left behind in the Zareba to guard our gear), I found there were eight killed and seven wounded, among the former being, I regret to say, two of the most excellent officers in Her Majesty's Service, Lieutenants Alfred Pigott and Rudolf De Lisle, R.N.

After the fight, I found the bodies of these officers, of J. Burleigh and F. Nye, able seamen, together with most of the wounded, about 20 yards to the left rear of the gun outside the square, which led me to believe they were borne away in the crush I have described, when the enemy turned away from the left flank, and headed across the rear face of the square. was corroborated by some of the wounded.

I computed the number of killed visible on the battle-field outside the grass to be about 800, amongst them being several horsemen, one of whom by his position, and that of his horse, must have got actually into the square, but I was afterwards told that there were quite as many, if not more, killed in the grass.

After attending to the wounded, the square was reformed at about 2.30, and we proceeded to Abou Klea Wells, arriving shortly after 5 A.M. As we had to haul our Gardner gun the whole way over very rough ground with a diminished

crew, we were not sorry to arrive.

We bivouacked in a defensive formation at the Abou Klea Wells on the night of the 17th, which was bitterly cold and must have been a terrible trial to the wounded, as we had no provisions, blankets, or covering of any description.

I beg to be allowed to say a word of grateful praise to the Medical Officers, whose untiring zeal and devotion to the wounded that night can

never be forgotten.

18th January. Detachment and camels joined us from the Zareba. At 2 P.M., the column started for Metemmeh, leaving the wounded entrenched at Abou Klea. The column marched without stopping all through the afternoon and night until 6.30 A.M. on the morning of the 19th, when we observed the Nile to our front, and Metemmeh to our left front. The enemy very shortly began to form up on one of the hills. The General meanwhile formed a temporary Zareba, and ordered the men to get their break-The enemy then fast as quickly as possible. proceeded to send out about 600 sharpshooters, who kept up a very hot fire on three sides of the square front and rear faces and right flank. During this fire, the column lost a number in killed and wounded, among the latter being Brigadier-General Sir H. Stewart, and Lieutenant Munro, R.N., who experienced the unusual occurrence of being wounded in seven places by one bullet. During this time, the Gardner gun was placed about 10 yards outside the square, near the corner formed by the rear face and left flank. It was directed where the fire appeared to be hottest without much result, as the enemy were well covered, lying down behind the grasss About 10 A.M., square was formed with about 1,000 men in the rear of the Zareba. I, being ordered to take command of the remaining 300 men, composed of details of various regiments, Transport Department, Medical Department, Artillery, Engineers, and Naval Brigade, proceeded to make two forts, about 200 yards apart, out of camel saddles, provision boxes, and thorn bushes. The larger fort contained all the sick and wounded, 3 artillery guns, 7-pounder screw guns, and the Gardner. Two of the artillery guns and the Gardner were mounted for action, there being no room for the third artillery gun. The whole of the camels, some 2,000, were made to lie down in a circle outside the larger fort, and formed an admirable means of defence. These forts were constructed during a severe fire from the enemy in the bushes and trees about 800 yards distant. Officers and men worked, however, cheerily and well. On the square moving out to meet the enemy, I observed them forming up in three V-shaped columns, the third one being the largest. One column was in rear of the other.

Captain Norton, R.A., served the two artillery

guns most admirably, and completely demora-lised the 3rd or reserve column of the enemy, entirely upsetting its formation, and changing it into a disorderly crowd. The Gardner gun was brought to bear on the 1st and 2nd columns with very good effect. We could observe that the enemy charged down on the square, but without the same ferocious determination as at Abou Klea. The square appeared to be as steady as a rock, and, as far as could be seen, none of the enemy got within 50 yards of it. The enemy then retired, and the square marched to the Nile, distant about 21 miles.

About an hour after, at 1.30 P.M., the enemy ceased their rifle fire on the forts, leaving us

unmolested for the night.

20th January. Square returned, having left a small force holding a position on the river. 4 P.M. the whole column marched on the Nile.

21st January. A reconnaissance was made in the direction of Metemmeh. The Gardner gun, under the command of Mr. Webber, boatswain (every other naval officer having been killed or wounded), accompanied this column. Gordon's four steamers "Bordein," "Safia," "Twifiea," and "Tull-howeiya" arrived.

22nd January. After some slight repairs to

engines, I reported the steamers ready to proceed

to Khartoum at 3 P.M.

Took command of Gordon's four steamers. Proceeded to Shendy, distant about 7 miles, in "Bordein" and "Tull-howeiya," taking Bashi-Bazouks and the crews I found in the vessels. Fired a few shell into Shendy, and cleared a

small earthwork. Received no opposition. 24th January. 7 a.m., Sir C. Wilson left for Khartoum in "Bordein" and "Tull-howeiya" with a detachment of the Sussex Regiment and the Soudanese troops, about 280. The Naval the Soudanese troops, about 280. Brigade was ordered to remain at Goubat, where they were encamped. Repaired on board "Safia" with detachment of Naval Brigade and Gardner gun. Sent the Egyptian troops from steamer "Bordein" to garrison island opposite the Eng-

lish camp, Goubat, and make earthworks there. Went down to Shendy, where the enemy opened a hot fire on the steamer. We dispersed

them with shell and the Gardner gun.

General Sir H. Stewart was put on board the "Twifiea," but she was also used as a ferry-boat between the island and the English camp to

bring food across for camels.

25th to 30th January. Weighed daily at 6 A.M., taking on board 20 carefully picked shots from one of the regiments, proceeding up or down the river at distances varying from 10 miles down to 15 miles up, capturing cattle, sheep, goats, vegetables, &c., as food for the camp; raiding villages, driving the men out. Destroyed strong earthwork without guns in it during this period. In our passages up or down the river we were always fired at by parties all along the left bank of from 5 to 20 riflemen, but our bullet-proof shields prevented any casualties.

31st January. 2nd division of Naval Brigade, under the command of Lieutenant Van Kough-

net, arrived.

1st February. Lieutenant Stuart Wortley arrived at Goubat with the news of the fall of Khartoum, and the loss of the two steamers "Bordein" and "Tull-howeiya," also reporting that Sir C. Wilson and his party, together with the Bashi-Bazouks, were encamped on an island about 30 miles to the southward of Goubat, and a short distance to the southward of a strong

divisions of the Naval Brigade, with 20 picked shots of the mounted infantry. Mounted the 2 Gardners on a platform amidships in echelon, and proceeded with all despatch (about $2\frac{1}{2}$ knots) for the relief of Sir C. Wilson.

2nd February. Proceeded up the river. 3rd February. At 7 a.m. observed a very strong earthwork on starboard hand; four embrasures in it; Sir C. Wilson's steamer on the rocks, about a quarter of a mile beyond it. Instructed riflemen, Gardner and howitzers guns crews to fire solely into the embrasures as the ship passed the fort, and not at bodies of riflemen I perceived on the banks.

Opened fire with bow gun at 1,200 yards. Enemy opened heavy rifle fire from 600 or 800 rifles, all along the bank, and also with gun from

embrasure pointed down stream.

Owing to the depth of water the steamer had to pass at about 80 yards from the fort, but the machine gun and marksmen's fire, directed into the embrasures, was so accurate and terrific, that the enemy were luckily unable to fire their two guns when the fort bore on the beam, distant 80 yards.

When the steamer had passed the fort about 200 yards, the machine guns would no longer bear, and but comparatively few of the riflemen could get their rifles to bear over the stern.

The enemy then sent a shot into the boiler. Observing the paddles still moving, I headed the steamer towards the opposite bank, and, waiting until her weigh was lost, anchored. The enemy, on seeing this catastrophe, redoubled I got up some planks and mounted one of the Gardner guns aft, cutting a hole in the after side of the battery, where one of the 7-prs. were, and by cutting off about a foot of the trail with a saw, we were enabled to fire this gun, although it capsized after every round, as there was no recoil.

The gun, Gardner, and rifles, were all directed at the embrasure facing up stream, to prevent the enemy either getting their gun to bear on the steamer from the earthwork, or taking the gun out of the earthwork, so that they could bring it to bear on us from another position (as the earthwork was close down to the water at the bottom of a steep incline). Had they attempted to remove the gun they would have been exposed to the fire from the steamer.

From 7.30 to 8.30 P.M. a continuous fire, without a minute's intermission, was kept up with the 7-pr. Gardner and the riflemen, who were told off in reliefs on the earthwork and embra-

The enemy were equally diligent, particularly with their rifles, their bullets rattling like hail all over the ship. They managed to fire several rounds from the gun, none of the enemy, how-ever, could train it on the vessel, on account of the hot fire, and the shots travelled more than

100 yards to the right of the steamer.

Having communicated with Sir C. Wilson in the evening, and arranged that his party should land on the opposite bank, while his sick and wounded should float down in a nuggah after dark, I hauled the boats, four in number (brought up to take his party back) alongside the vessels, hoping the enemy might think we were deserting the steamers, as at night, although we could not see them they could see us, and I feared that they would take their guns out of the fort, run them up the bank abreast of the vessel, where their range would be under 100 yards, and where they must most certainly sink us.

earthwork, where there were some 5,000 men. The ruse answered perfectly. I ceased firing I picked the crew of the steamer from both and maintained a dead silence before Sir C. I ceased firing Wilson and his party floated down in the nuggah. The enemy opened fire on the nuggah, but, being dark, with little effect, and after it had passed them took their guns out of the fort, and fired several rounds at the steamer, accom-panied by a heavy rifle fire. To this I decided not to reply, remaining perfectly silent. The enemy, evidently thinking we had gone, ceased

firing for the night.

At 11 A.M. on the 3rd, when the boiler had got cool, Mr. Benbow, Chief Engineer, commenced to repair it. This took ten hours. Too much credit cannot be given to this officer, as he had to shape the plate, bore the holes in plate and boiler, and run down the screws and nuts, almost entirely with his own hands, the artificers and everyone in the stokehold having been scalded severely by the explosion when the shot entered the boiler. The plate was 16" × 14". Some idea can therefore be formed of the work entailed on

The boiler being repaired by 9 P.M., at 5 A.M. the following morning (4th February) I ordered fires to be lit, furnace doors to be kept closed, and every precaution taken to prevent sparks coming out of the funnel, and it was not until 5.50 within 10 minutes of daylight, and the steam being ready for proceeding, that the enemy perceived that we had remained on board, and their chance of destroying us lost. They gave vent to the most fiendish yells, and got their guns to bear on the steamer, but by the time they commenced firing, I had weighed anchor, and proceeded to the southward. After going up for three-quarters of a mile where there was more room, we turned the vessel round, and came past the fort, using the guns, Gardners, and riflemen in the same manner as on the previous day. After passing the fort, I was much disappointed to find the nuggah, containing the sick and wounded of Sir C. Wilson's party, aground on a rock, just within range of it. I anchored the steamer as near as I could to the rocks, and sent Sub-Lieutenant Keppel away to get her afloat. This he succeeded in doing in the most clever and gallant manner in three hours, exposed to a smart fire all the time. He was most ably assisted by Captain Gasgoyne, who was with Sir Charles Wilson's party in the nuggah all the time. On the nuggah getting afloat we weighed and proceeded about two miles down the river, picked up Sir C. Wilson's party who had marched down on the right bank, and proceeded to Goubat, arriving about 5.45 P.M. During this action there were fired 5,400 rounds of Gardners, 126 of howitzer, and 2,150 from Martini-Henry.

I consider that we owe our safety in the steamer, as well as the safety of Sir Charles Wilson and his party, who undoubtedly would have been killed if the steamer had been destroyed, to the untiring energy of Sub-Lieutenant Keppel, and Mr. Webber, Boatswain (who worked the howitzer), to Lieutenaut Bower, commanding the picked shots of the Mounted Infantry, and Mr. Ingram of the Yeomanry, who is attached by order to the Naval Brigade, and who attended to the working of the Gardner, after Lieutenant Van Koughnet was wounded at the moment the fort bore on the beam. Surgeon May, R.N., was also very attentive to the wounded. Testimony must be borne to the splendid discipline maintained by the men, one and all, during a tremendous fire which lasted

13 hours.

5th February. Employed plugging bullet and shot holes, repairing vessels, &c.
6th February. Court-martial assembled on

board for trial of captains and reis of steamers "Bordein" and "Tull-howeiya" for wilfully losing their steamers, thereby causing vital danger to a part of Her Majesty's forces. Court acquitted the captains, found the reis guilty, sentenced him to death, but recommended him to mercy on account of his having brought Lieutenant Wortley down safely to report the situation of Sir Charles Wilson.

7th February. Captured a number of cattle and goats, obliged to return, steamer leaking so

badly.

9th to 11th February. Steamer leaking from many places. Starboard side of vessel came away from beams distant about 12 feet, starboard side of entry came away from fore foot. This must have been caused by the concussion of the gun in the action of 3rd February, there not being sufficient room for recoil, when fired in the position we had to put it.

11th February. Lieutenants Tyler and Montgomerie arrived to fill vacancies in the Naval

Brigade.

At 7 a.m. on 13th February, spiked the guns on board "Safia" and "Twifiea," and threw them overboard, together with all their ammunition. Took the eccentric bands from both the above steamers, engines, bivouacked on shore ready to start at daylight.
14th February. Daylight, left Goubat, with

column commanded by General Sir Redvers

Buller marching on foot.

15th February. Arrived at Abou Klea about

16th February. Naval Brigade ordered into fort with Gardners. Remainder of column

throwing up small earthworks.

5 p.m. About 1,000 of enemy appeared on hill, 200 of them having rifles, who kept up fire all night until 11 A.M., on the 17th, when Major Wardrop went out with a few scouts to reconnoitre, and the enemy retreated and left us unmolested.

17th to 22nd February. Remained at Abou-

Klea.

23rd February. Convoy with sick; provisions and all gear left at 2 P.M. At 7 P.M. General Sir R. Buller and all combatants proceeded for Gakdul, marching on foot. Picked up convoy at 11.30 and stopped for the night.

24th to 26th February. Proceeding to Gakdul. 27th February. Employed repairing camels'

sides by plugging them with oakum.
28th February. Left Gakdul for Korti with column composed of two divisions of Artillery, Medical Department details, a part of Commissariat and Transport Corps, and Naval Brigade.

1st to 6th March. Marching to Korti.
7th March. Arrived at Korti at 4.30 P.M. The men baving marched from Metemmeh without one falling out, a most creditable performance considering the state of their shoe leather, and the fact of their having to carry rifle, cutlass, and 70 rounds of ammunition, besides in many cases having to tow an obstinate and slow camel.

8th March. Lord Wolseley inspected the brigade on parade, expressing his extreme satisfaction at the work they had done, and the manner in which it had been performed.

9th March. Naval Brigade broken up, told off to different stations for the summer, and all placed under the orders of Captain Boardman. I myself being ordered to join the staff of General Lord Wolseley.

I should like to bring to the notice of their Lordships the admirable way the officers and men under my command have performed their duties during a period of considerable hardships, requiring all their energies and determination. In addition to the names of those officers already mentioned, I wish to particularise Commander Poore and Lieutenants Montgomerie and Van Koughnet, who was wounded early on the 3rd. I would add that owing to the whole of the officers of the 1st Division being killed or wounded, Mr. Webber, boatswain, has commanded that Division in action, when I was sent on other duty by the officer commanding the

I have heartily to thank Captain Boardman for the kind manner in which he has on all occasions taken a deep interest in the welfare and wants of the Naval Brigade since it has been formed, and by having had such an officer at the base, it has tided over many difficulties

which might otherwise have arisen.

I attach a complete list of the officers and men forming the Naval Brigade, also a list of those killed and wounded.

NOTIFICATION respecting the operation of "The West Africa Order in Council of

26th March, 1885." HEREAS by Section 37 of "The West Africa Order, 1885," it is provided that the said Order shall commence and have effect on and from the first day of the calendar month next but one after the month in which it was published in the London Gazette, or on such later day as a Secretary of State, by a notice published in the London Gazette at the time of or subsequently to the publication of the said Order, appoints. And whereas the said Order was duly published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of this month. And whereas it is expedient to appoint a later day for the commencement of the said Order. THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree of the King of the Belgians respecting quarantine in Belgium, which was published in the Moniteur Belge of the 24th instant, and of which the following is a translation :-

ART 1. Arrivals from Spanish Mediterranean ports (with the exception of those in the Balearic Islands) after a voyage of less than twelve days will have to complete in quarantine the period of twelve days.

ART. 2. Free pratique will be allowed them after the twelfth day if the medical visits which will be made to them do not bring to light any suspicious circumstance. Where this may not be the case the medical officer of the quarantine station will immediately inform the Governor of the Province, who will arrange with the competent authority as to the measures to be taken in respect of arrivals which are regarded as under suspicion.

ART. 3. The importation or transit of unwashed rags, bedding, and linen (except the minor baggage of travellers), coming from Spain is forbidden.

ART. 4. Nevertheless, new waste coming direct from spinning, weaving, or clothing mills, will be admitted for importation or transit conditionally upon its place of origin being proved by a written declaration of the manufacturer at the mill where it comes from. This declaration must be correctly certified and legalized by the loca authority or Belgian Consul at the place from which it is sent.

ART. 5. The things mentioned in Article 3, coming from countries other than Spain, will only be admitted for importation and transit upon proof of their origin to the satisfaction of the Customs authorities.

ART. 6. The Minister of the Interior and of Public Instruction is authorized to extend the same prohibitions to other countries in which the existence of cholera may be proved or suspected, and to take all other measures of precaution which the spread of the epidemic may necessitate.

ART. 7. The Minister of the Interior and of Public Instruction is charged with the execution of this Decree, which shall take effect from the day after its publication in the Moniteur.

Translation of a Proclamation issued by the Danish Ministry of Justice, containing measures of Quarantine on ships arriving from Spanish Mediterranean ports.

The Ministry of Justice, by virtue of the

powers vested in them under section 1 of the Act of the 30th March, 1885, respecting additional precautions to prevent the importation of Asiatic cholera into Denmark, do hereby order that quarantine shall be imposed in pursuance of the provisions of the above-named Act, with respect to ships arriving from, or that have been in communication on the voyage with ships coming from any Spanish Mediterranean ports.

Moreover, the Order of the Ministry of Justice, dated the 17th of September, 1884, prohibiting the importation into Denmark of the following articles in ships coming from or that have been in communication with any of the ports above referred to, still remains in force, viz. :-

Used linen, used wearing apparel, used bed clothes (provided the said articles do not belong to a passenger's private effects), rags, used wadding, wool, paper refuse, hair, and skins.
