REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from St. Petersburg, transmitting a copy of a Decision of the Imperial Russian Council, dated the 25 February 9 March, amending and supplementing the regulations hitherto in force for the settlement of disputes arising out of the application of the Customs Tariff, and instituting a Special Council at the Ministry of Finance for the examination of appeals against the decisions of the Customs Department. The substance of the Decree referred to is as follows:—

1. Articles of merchandize not mentioned in the Customs Tariff, or which do not correspond with any of the articles mentioned therein, will, for the future, be charged with the duty applicable to those articles to which they approach most nearly either in nature or quality.

2. When, after the tariff has been applied, the Officer of Customs has any doubt as to its application, he will allow the goods to pass, after taking a sample, which will be forwarded to the Customs Department with the necessary explanations.

3. If the importer believes the application of the tariff to be irregular he should make a declaration to the Customs Officers at the time of the assessment of duty, and this declaration is at once to be put into writing and brought under the notice of the principal of the Customs bureau at the particular place of entry. Should the importer be dissatisfied with the decision of the bureau, an appeal must be lodged within twenty-four hours after that decision has been notified to him, and the appeal will be communicated to the Customs Department within seven days after the application of the tariff.

4. The decision of the Customs Department will be notified to the parties interested by the bureau where the goods were passed, and an appeal from this decision may be addressed to the Ministry of Finance within seven days after the notification thereof.

5. In cases where it is decided that a larger amount of duty than that first fixed was really chargeable, the importer must deposit the difference as soon as the final decision has been notified to him.

6. A special council is to be instituted at the Ministry of Finance for the examination of such questions as may be raised as to the application of the tariff, and also for examining appeals against the decisions of the Customs Department. This Council will be composed of the Directors and Vice-Directors of the Department of Commerce and Manufacturers and of the Customs Department, the "Chefs de Section" of those departments, and two or three experts nominated by the Minister of Finance, or of members of the "Conseil du Commerce" possessing superior technical qualifications.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Decree in relation to quarantine which has recently been issued by the Government of Italy:—

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 2.

The Minister of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20, 1865, cap. C, on public health, and to the Ministerial Instructions of December 26, 1871, it having been officially ascertained that the epidemic at present existing in Jativa, although up till now it has attained but small proportions, shows some of the characteristics of cholera, decrees:—

ART. 1. Vessels arriving on and after to-day's date in the harbours or landing-places of the Kingdom of Italy from the Spanish coast of the Mediterranean, or from any islands adjacent to that coast, without any case of illness during the voyage shall be subjected to three days' quarantine of observation, to be performed in the localities appointed by Article 130 of the above-mentioned Ministerial Instructions.

ART. 2. In the case of ships arriving from the above-mentioned district, on board of which cases or even suspected cases of cholera have occurred during the voyage, or should occur during the quarantine of observation, the Sanitary Officials should keep those ships under strict surveillance in the most absolute isolation, and enquire the determination of the Ministry as to the treatment to be applied to them.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Cholera Regulations (Rags from Marseilles or Toulon): Rescinding Orders:—

To all Port Sanitary Authorities;—

To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities;—

To all Officers of Customs;—

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid;—

To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by two Orders dated the 22nd day, and an Order dated the 23rd day of July, 1884, We, the Local Government Board, in consequence of the prevalence of Cholera at Marseilles and Toulon, in France, prescribed certain rules and regulations with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags exported from either of those places and consigned to this country;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Orders should be rescinded:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We, hereby rescind the above-cited Orders dated the twenty-second

and the twenty-third days of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

The other portion of the shoal is a ridge lying about a third of a mile seaward, and is about a mile in length in a direction parallel to the shore.

NOTE.—Vessels navigating in the vicinity should keep outside the 5-fathoms line.
