REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention card above referred to, which will be submitted to 'The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case

the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Corporation of Bishop's Castle, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

"Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised:

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the District which, before March 24th, 1885, was the Poor Law Parish, called the Borough of Bishop's Castle, in the Clun Union, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation:

"And whereas the said petition for a charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said district a municipal borough, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter:

"And whereas the borough of Bishop's Castle is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal

Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said all the franchises, rights, privileges, powers, place is co-extensive with the area of the municipal borough proposed to be created by the said charter:

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorize the establishment or continuance of any Court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act:

"And whereas the Bailiff and Burgesses of the borough of Bishop's Castle are a Local Authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

"And whereas the said Bailiff and Burgesses are a body corporate under and by virtue of

certain Royal or other charters:

"And whereas the area of the proposed borough is within the district of the Guardians of the Clun Union as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Union, and whereas the said Guardians as such Rural Sanitary Authority are a Local Authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to such Rural Sanitary Authority, so far as the same relate to the area of the proposed borough, should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner provided by this scheme:

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a Scheme should be settled pursuant to part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter contained.

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows :-

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Bishop's Castle Scheme, 1885.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough, created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as the 'commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The Bailiff and Burgesses of the Borough of Bishop's Castle are herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the charter above mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New

Corporation.

"4. The municipal borough created by the charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Clun Union.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be, and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with jurisdiction, authority, and exemptions of the said Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be, which have no pecuniary value.

"6. All property (not being property within the meaning of the second sub-section of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act), possessed by, or vested in, the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, shall vest in the New Corporation, and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

"7. All market property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation and all liabilities attaching to the Old Corporation in respect of the same shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough, acting by the Council as the

Sanitary Authority.

"8. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 6 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

-"9. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 6 may extend to

satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"10. Any sewers, drains, culverts, pipes, or other sanitary works situate within the area of the proposed borough being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Clun Union, and used by them for the purpose of the drainage, watersupply, or cleansing of the said area, and any liabilities attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority in respect of the said area shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

"11. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"12. The term market property in this Scheme means and includes rights to market tolls and all franchises, liberties, privileges, and rights relating to markets and all lands and premises used for the purpose of markets.

"13. The Mayor of the Borough created by the charter shall for the time being by virtue of his office have the right now enjoyed by the Bailiff for the time being of the borough of Bishop's Castle to vote at the election of almsmen for the charity of the Hospital of the Holy and Undivided Trinity at Clun, and to act as governor and auditor thereof, as heretofore the said Bailiff has been accustomed to do.

"14. For the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and this scheme, so far as the same relate to freemen, the old Corporation shall be deemed to have been dissolved by the said Act; and all the rights and exemptions reserved by and the provisions of Section 10 of the said Act shall

apply accordingly.

"Every person now claiming to be entitled as a freeman or burgess or otherwise, in accordance with the provisions of section 10 sub-section 1 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, shall, on or before the expiration of one calendar month from the commencement of this scheme, send to the Town Clerk his claim in writing, and future claims shall be similarly sent in on or before the 1st day of September in every year. The Town Clerk shall within one month after the expiration of the time for sending in claims make out a roll (to be called 'the Freemen's Roll') containing the names of all such claimants and the names of those previously admitted and then alive; and such rolls shall be revised and settled by the Mayor on such day or days as he shall from time to time appoint, provided that such day or days shall be fixed to be at least one month after, but within two months of the expiration of the time for sending in claims, and that public notice of every such appointment has been given by him by affixing notice thereof fourteen days previously on or near the outer door of the Townhall in the said

"On every such revision the Mayor shall examine into the claims and all objections thereto, and shall retain on or add to the roll the names of those persons only who are entitled to be on the roll, and shall sign the roll when complete.

"No person who shall once have established his claim shall (if alive) be struck off the roll on any subsequent revision, unless notice in writing of any objection to his claim be served on him at least seven days previously to the date fixed for such revision.

"The Freemen's Roll shall be kept by the Town Clerk, and shall be open to inspection at his office by any person at all reasonable times on payment of a fee of one shilling, and he shall supply printed copies thereof to any applicants at the

price of one shilling each.

"The property (if any) to which the freemen aforesaid are for the time being entitled shall be managed by the New Corporation, and the payments specified in or authorised by sub-section 1 (a) of section 10 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, (if any) shall be made by the Treasurer of the borough, who shall annually prepare an account showing in detail all such payments, and the surplus remaining after payment thereof, and the New Corporation shall deal with the surplus as by law required.

"The payments specified or referred to in subsection l (d) of section 10 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, shall be made to the

Treasurer of the borough.

"The Town Clerk is authorised and required, when making out the first Roll of Freemen to insert the name of any freeman whom the books of the Corporation show to have taken up his freedom, and who is known to be alive."

All property of any kind whatsoever possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second sub-section of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in the following persons (to be designated "The Trustees of Municipal Charities in the Borough of Appleby,"). viz., Thomas Wilson, of Bongate, in the parish of St. Michael, Appleby, in the county of Westmorland, Gentleman, Fergus Armstrong, of Appleby, Gentleman, and James Parkinson Shepherd, of Battle-barrow, of the said parish, Gentleman, jointly, to be by them applied in the manner in which and for the purposes for which such property, or the income thereof, was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

7. All market property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, and all liabilities attachshall vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

All property other than that in paragraphs 6 and 7 hereof referred to, possessed by, or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation or any of its members as such, shall vest in the New Corporation, and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

#### N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration at any time.

1. Competitive examinations of caudidates for situations in the different public departments will be held at such times and at such places as may be deemed expedient. Before every such examination Special Regulations will be issued, in which the particular conditions of the competition will be specified.

2. These examinations will have reference either to the vacancies existing at the time of the examinations respectively, or to the number which may be estimated to occur within any period not exceeding six months after the commencement of the examinations, as may be laid down in Special Regulations, or in any notice of such examinations published, with the approval of the Lords of the Treasury, in the London Gazette.

3. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, being of the requisite age, health, and character. The undermentioned restrictions are at present in force :-

(i.) Persons actually serving in the Army and

Navy are ineligible.

(ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to

(a.) Persons holding situations in the Civil

Service.

(b.) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of less than 12 years' service.

(c.) Apprentices and Engineer Students in Her Majesty's Dockyards.

(d.) Persons who have been trained in Normal Schools at the public expense.

(e.) Persons who have been trained in the Laboratory of the Inland Revenue Department.

Persons comprised in the classes (a), (b,)(c) must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their department to attend the examination, duted before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (d) will not be qualified to received apppointments until the consent of the Committee of Council on Education, Great Britain, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (e) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
