EXCHEQUER BILLS.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice to the holders of Exchequer Bills issued under the authority of the Act 29 V., c. 25, and dated the 11th June, 1881, that the Interest thereon for the half year ending on the 11th June, 1885, will be payable at the Bank of England, on and after the 11th June next; and that the Interest of such Exchequer Bills for the following half year, to 11th December, 1885, will be at the rate of two per centum per annum.
