REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT St. James's Palace.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamber-lain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'cloch, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The .Contágious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected

with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

An Area at Broughton, in the petty sessional division of Romsey, in the county of Hants, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Stone Farm on the east, by the road leading from Stone Farm to Broughton Firs on the north, thence in a straight line to Nine Mile -Water on the north-west, thence in a straight line to the Farm in the occupation of Mr. Arnold on the Salisbury-road (leaving the Farm on the south and not including it) on the west, and thence in a straight line to Broughton Hill on the Mottisfont-road on the south, and thence back by the road leading to Stone Farm again on the east.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Proclamation, relating to quarantine, which has been issued by the Danish Government:

PROCLAMATION revoking the Order of the Minister of Justice issued on the 14th of January, 1885.

The Proclamation of the Ministry of Justice, issued on the 14th of January last, prescribing that the provisions contained in clause 2, section 1, of the Act of the 2nd of July, 1880, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into Denmark, should come into force until further notice, with respect to all ships coming from, or that have been in communication with, any French port, or that have received any persons on board during the voyage from a ship coming from France, is hereby revoked.

This Order shall at once take effect.
