The Letters from C f.disz: confirm, That the Serasquier of the Mirea (who was fent for to Court by the new Visier Knperla) had in his march, with 3 or 400 men, towards Adrimople, been surprised by the Buigarians, and most of his men cut in pieces, he himfelt escaping with great difficulty. The Turks have put some little Succor into Napoli di Malvassia, the Garison whereof was before reduced to great necesfity, and without a fresh supply they will not, as our last Advices assure us, be able to hold out above a fortnight or 3 weeks longer. By a Veffel come from Dalmatia we are informed, that the Proveditore-General Molino was gone from Zara towards Spalatro, where he had ordered his Troops, and the Morlaques, to Rendezvous, in order to their entring upon Action. The great Convoy will fail from hence with the first fair Wind for the Levant; and with it will be fent 70000 Zequins for the payment of our Forces. Lienna, April 6. The Bassa-Aga of Canisa had the 31st past Audience of the Count de Staremberg Vice-President of the Council of War; and on the 3st Initant he was sent back with the Emperor's Katrication of the Articles of Capitulation; in which there had been made some little alteration. The Turks are to march out of Canisa with their Arms and Baggage, but without Cannon, or Drums beating, or Colours Hying; They are to be conducted to the Save with a convenient number of Wagons, and

We have an account by Letters of the 17th past from Niga, that the Turks were again gathering together in great numbers between $B_{eco.l}$ and Bagnaluca in Bojnia; and there was a report, that 6000 of the Tartars, who lately retired towards Budziack, were coming back to joyn them, in order to some important design before our Army takes the Field. The Prince of Esterbasi Palatine of Hunary, who arrived here this week, has had feveral Conferences with the Ministers of this Court about the Affairs of that Kingdom. They write from Five Churches, that on the 18th paft 264 Turks, after having abjured their Errors, were Christned by the Bilhop of Sirmia.

Cologne, Apr. 14. The two Brand nharg Bartalion, now in Garifon here, have received Orders from Lieutenant-General Spain to march the next week, in order to their joyning with the rest of his Electoral Highnes's Forces quartered in the Country of Julion, which are to advance towards the Mojelle. We are told from European, that the Duke of Lorrain was expected three in few days, to affift at a Council of War, which is to be held with the Imperial and Confederate Generals; and that the Forces which are to act under his Highners's Command this Sunmer, are to be at the General Rendezvous by the beginning of the next Month.

Hamburg, April 14. This City is very much preffed to publish the Imperial Avocatoria, commanding them (as a Member of the Empire) to interdict all Trade with France, and to oblige the French Retident to depart this place; and the 27th of this Month is the ultimate time allowed them for the doing of it; which it's not doubted but they will comply with.
