

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of West Wrattling, in the county of Cambridge, and in the diocese of Ely, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of sixty-seven pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also grant and convey to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of West Wrattling, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, the annual tenths or payments amounting to sixteen shillings and one penny, heretofore payable in respect of the said vicarage of West Wrattling, and formerly receivable by the Bishop of Ely, and latterly by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners: To have and to hold the said annual tenths or payments to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of sixty-seven pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do

hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Meldreth, in the county of Cambridge, and in the diocese of Ely, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage (first) the annual tenths or payments amounting to nine shillings and eleven pence, heretofore payable in respect of the said vicarage of Meldreth, and formerly receivable by the Bishop of Ely, and latterly by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and (secondly) all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the messuage or dwelling-house and other buildings thereon, and the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us under and by virtue of a certain deed of conveyance, dated the second day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and made between John Linton, of Westwick, in the said county of Cambridge, Esquire, of the first part, Charles Ellis, of Meldreth aforesaid, Farmer, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the third part, which said deed of conveyance is intended to be deposited in the Registry of the said diocese of Ely, together with this instrument, after the publication of the latter in the London Gazette: To have and to hold the said annual tenths, and the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the messuage or dwelling-house and other buildings thereon, and the appurtenances thereunto belonging, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage of Meldreth shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the messuage or dwelling-house and other buildings thereon, for and in respect of the period intervening between the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of certain benefactions, consisting (first) of a sum of one hundred and fifty pounds sterling which has been paid to us in favour of the benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Carrington, in the county of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Southwell, and (secondly) of a piece or parcel of land comprising three thousand three hundred and fifty-two square yards, or thereabouts, which has been permanently secured to the same benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Carrington, to meet the aforesaid benefactions, one:
