Affairs has received a communication from the French Ambassador to the effect that a Treaty of Peace having been signed between France and China on the 9th instant, the French Government, without awaiting the ratification of the Treaty, have issued orders to the Commander of the French Naval Forces to raise the blockade of the coast of China, and to cease exercising the right of visit on the high seas for contraband of war; whereby trade in the eastern seas under all flags is re-established under the same conditions as before the outbreak of hostilities.

Warrants or either of them, and all regulations and conditions now in force as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post, between the Straits Settlements and any other country or place as aforesaid shall extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Kingdom of Siam, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants in the same way as if the Kingdom of Siam, had been named or referred to in the said Warrants and the schedules thereunder written in the same manner as the Straits Settlements are named or referred to therein.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Cholera Regulations.—(Rags from Spain.)

To all Port Sanitary Authorities :-To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities ;-To all Officers of Customs ;

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid;—
To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent in certain parts of Spain, and it is expedient that regulations should be made with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags from that country:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations, and declare that they shall be en-forced and executed by the Authority or Au-thorities hereinafter specified:—

ARTICLE 1. In this Order-

The term "Sanitary Authority" means Port Sanitary Authority, Urban Sanitary Authority, or Rural Sanitary Authority;

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs;

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship.

ARTICLE 2. From and after the date of this Order, and until the first day of November, 1885, no rags from Spain shall be delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, nor landed in any port or place in England or Wales.

ARTICLE 3. If any rags shall be delivered overside or landed in contravention of this Order, they shall, unless forthwith exported, be destroyed by the person having control over the same with such precautions as may be directed by the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary Authority within whose jurisdiction or district the same may be found.

ARTICLE 4. All masters of vessels, consignees, and other persons having control of any rags prohibited under this Order from being delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, or landed, are required to obey these regulations.

ARTICLE 5. All Officers of Customs are empowered to prevent the delivery overside or landing of rags in contravention of this Order.

ARTICLE 6. It shall be the duty of the Sanitary Authority to take proceedings against masters of ships, consignees, or other persons having control over any rags, who shall wilfully neglect or refuse to obey or carry out, or shall obstruct the execution of any of these regulations.

ORDER AS TO STAMPS.

QRDER as to the Fees and Per-Centages which are required to be taken for Bankruptcy Proceedings in the High Court of Justice and Court of Appeal by means of Stamps, amending the previous Order on the same subject, published in the Supplement to the London Gazette of the 28th of December, 1883.

WHEREAS by section three of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, it is provided that the Treasury may from time to time make and when made, revoke, alter, and add to, regulations for all or any of the following purposes respecting fees in any Public Office, that is to say:

(1.) Regulating the manner in which the fees taken in money are to be taken, accounted for, and

(2.) Determining the use of impressed or adhesive stamps, and the mode of cancellation of adhesive stamps.

(3.) Regulating the use of stamps and prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use, and requiring documents to be used for the purpose of such stamps.

Provided that so far as they relate to the office of any Court of Law, they shall be made with the consent of the Lord Chancellor.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Lords of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, with the

concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, hereby give notice and order and direct:-

That from and after the first day of July, 1885, in lieu of any regulations on the subject heretofore in force, the stamps used for denoting the fees and percentages described in the schedule hereto subjoined shall, so far as they are payable in regard to proceedings in the High Court of Justice and Court of Appeal, be of the character and the applied and otherwise dealth as prescribed by such schedule. And we do further enjoin that this Order shall be binding on all Courts, Officers, and persons whom such regulations may in any way affect.

The adhesive stamps herein referred to shall be of the description overprinted with the word "Bankruptcy," except where otherwise provided. They shall be cancelled by the various Court or other officials by perforation or in such manner as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time direct. The impressed stamps also shall be of such character as the said Commissioners

may adopt for the purpose.

The official forms with impressed or adhesive stamps (as the case may be) required in respect of any proceedings herein referred to may be obtained at the Inland Revenue Offices, Royal Courts of Justice. Persons may, however, in addition have their own forms stamped at that office or at the corresponding office at Somerset House.
