Swindon.—Forthwith and entirely in the particular Baptist Chapel, South-street, in the parish of Old Swindon, in the county of Wilts; and also in the chapelyard except for the burial of so many members or late members of the congregation who shall have attained the age of sixty years at the date of the Order.
