THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANI-MALS) TRANSFER OF PARTS OF DISTRICTS ACT, 1884.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council approved on the 17th day of July, 1885, of an Agreement bearing date the 25th day of May, 1885, made between the Local Authority of the county of Denbigh of the first part, the Local Authority of the borough of Wrexham of the second part, the Local Authority of the borough of Denbigh of the third part, and the Local Authority of the borough of Ruthin of the fourth part, for the formation of a Joint Committee of such several Local Authorities under section 3 of the above-mentioned Act, whereby such several Local Authorities assigned to the said Joint Committee the whole of the district of the constituent Authorities aforesaid and delegated to the said Joint Committee the whole of the jurisdiction of the said several Local Authorities under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.
