THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANI-MALS) TRANSFER OF PARTS OF DISTRICTS ACT, 1884.

INSTRUMENT altering the Boundaries of the Particular District of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, in the County of Surrey and Diocese of Rochester.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting.

WHEREAS by an Instrument, bearing date on or about the sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, a particular district, comprising certain portions of the parish of Coulsdon, of the parish of Caterham, and of the parish of Warlingham, all in the county of Surrey, and at that time all in the diocese of Winchester, was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Luke, situate at Caterham Valley, in the parish of Caterham aforesaid, and the same was called "The Particular District of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley."

And whereas the said particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, is now in the diocese of Rochester.

And whereas it appears to us, the said Commissioners, to be expedient that the boundaries of such particular district should be altered as hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas a draft or copy of the instrument by which such alteration is proposed to be effected has been duly transmitted to the respective patrons and incumbents of the said particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, of the said parish of Coulsdon, of the said parish of Caterham, and of the said parish of Warlingham, as contemplated by the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, section two.

And whereas the patron of the particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley aforesaid, and the Incumbent of the parish of Warlingham aforesaid, have submitted certain objections to the proposed alteration of boundaries, but the other patrons and the other Incumbents to whom the drafts or copies were so transmitted as aforesaid have made no objections.
