THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, reporting that the authorities in Russia have deemed it possible to subject vessels arriving from Spain which have kept five days quarantine at Gibraltar, only to a strict medical inspection with all the consequences of the sanitary conditions which may be proved; and, considering the local measures of quarantine adopted at Gibraltar with regard to vessels arriving from Spain, and the positive declaration of Her Majesty's Government that the town of Gibraltar is in a good sanitary condition, find no reason for declaring the port of Gibraltar infected.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at St. José, Costa Rica, reporting that owing to the re-appearance of Asiatic cholera in Spain, the Costa Rican Government have ordered that bills of health of all vessels proceeding from Europe, and arriving at the ports of Puntarenas and Limon, of that Republic, should bear the visâ of the Costa Rican Consular Officer, who will at the same time inform the captains of said vessels of the necessity of hoisting a "white" flag on their arrival at either of the aforementioned ports if their bill of health is clean, or a "yellow" flag if otherwise.

In the case of a vessel arriving from an infected or suspicious port with a clean bill of health, she will be liable to be ordered to the lazaretto and undergo a quarantine of six days observation, or until such times as not a vestige of the cholera remains on board, and for the necessary days afterwards, for the complete disinfecting of passengers, crew, &c.
