CEREMONIAL observed at the Marriage of Her Royal Highness the Princess Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodore, Fifth Daughter of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and of His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, and Prince of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, with His Royal Highness The Prince Henry Maurice of Battenberg, K.G., Third Son of His Grand Ducal Highness The Prince Alexander of Hesse, G.C.B., and Her Serene Highness the Princess of Battenberg, which Ceremony took place at Whippingham Church, in the Isle of Wight, on Thursday, 23rd of July, at One o'clock.

A Special Train left Victoria Station at nine o'clock on the Morning of the Ceremony and conveyed Her Majesty's Guests, with the Members of Her Majesty's Household, and others in attendance on the Royal Personages, who had not previously assembled at Osborne, to Portsmouth, where the Royal Yacht "Alberta" was in waiting, and left at eleven o'clock for the landing place at East Cowes, arriving at twelve.

Carriages were here provided for their conveyance direct to Whippingham Church, where they were shown to the places assigned to them in the Choir before half-past twelve o'clock by Her

Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers appointed for the purpose.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Bishop of Winchester (Bishop of the Diocese), The Dean of Windsor (Domestic Chaplain to Her Majesty), and The Reverend Canon Prothero (Rector of Whippingham, and Chaplain in Ordinary to Her Majesty), arrived from the Rectory with the Choir, and took their places within the Rails of the Altar at twenty minutes to one o'clock, while a Voluntary was played on the Organ.

The Royal Family and other Royal Personages left Osborne House, where they had previously assembled with their Ladies and Gentlemen in Waiting, at half-past twelve, and proceeded in the Royal Carriages by the Queen's Gate to Whippingham Church in the following order—

The Queen, with The Bride and Bridegroom, accompanied by the other Royal Personages, then received the Congratulations of Her Majesty's Guests.

Luncheon was afterwards served for Her Majesty, The Royal Family, and Royal Guests, in a Tent upon the Lawn, during which the Band of the Royal Marines played, as also the Pipers of the Sutherland Highlanders.

There was a State Dinner Party in the Evening in the Tents on the Lawn, during which the Band of The Royal Marine Light Infantry played, after which Her Majesty and the Royal and other Guests proceeded to the Terrace, and witnessed an illumination of the Terrace and Grounds, and a display of Fireworks from The Royal Yacht "Victoria and Albert," Her Majesty's Ship "Hector," and the Yachts in Osborne Bay.
