The Minister of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20, 1865, on the public health and the Ministerial Instructions of December 26, 1871, in view of the constantly increasing diffusion and virulence of the cholera in Spain, decrees:—

The quarantine of observation prescribed by Ordinance No. 5 of the 5th of July last, for vessels arriving without a case of illness from all the ports on the coast of Spain and the Spanish Islands is from to-day's date raised to seven days.

This treatment is also applicable to ships which are at present in quarantine.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces of Italy are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

CIRCULAR.—Department of Charity and Health.

It being established by the sanitary intelligence communicated by the Spanish Consul at Marseilles that cholera prevails in that city:

In view of Articles 30, 35, and 36 of the Sanitary Law and the Decree of the 10th December, 1874:

This department has resolved to declare foul the vessels proceeding from the said port, whatever may be the date of their departure, and to

declare suspicious (comprometidas) those proceeding from the other Mediterranean ports of France, including the ports of the African possessions of that nation.

Wherefore, vessels proceeding from Marseilles will leave, subject to strict quarantine in a foul lazaret, according to the terms of Cap. IX of the Law, and those proceeding from the other ports referred to will have to submit to three days of observation at the port of arrival, discharging their cargo in so far as it consists of "contumacious" goods, in the manner prescribed in paragraph 4 of the Royal Decree of the 22nd of July last.

I communicate the above to you for your information, and in view of the provisions contained in the 4th paragraph of the Decree of the 24th April, 1875.
