Ordinance of Maritime Health.--No. 6. The Minister of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20, 1865, on the public health and the Ministerial Instructions of December 26, 1871, in view of the constantly increasing diffu-sion and virulence of the cholera in Spain, decrees :-

The quarantine of observation prescribed by Ordinance No. 5 of the 5th of July last, for vessels arriving without a case of illness from all the ports on the coast of Spain and the Spanish Islands is from to-day's date raised to seven days.

This treatment is also applicable to ships which are at present in quarantine.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces of Italy are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

THE Board of Trade have received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Vice-Consul at Fiume, reporting that all vessels from French Mediterranean and Algerian ports will, on arrival in Hungarian ports, be subjected to a quarantine of ten days if no case of infection occurs during the voyage, and, if a case of infection has occurred during the voyage, to a quarantine of at least twenty days, without having regard to the length of the voyage. Until further orders the importation and transit of rags, old cordage, used clothes, and used linen coming from the ports in question are prohibited. All quarantine has to be undergone at the lazaret at Martinschizza, to which vessels arriving from the ports in question are to be sent, and where certain disinfecting operations will be conducted.

CIRCULAR.—Department of Charity and Health. It being established by the sanitary intelligence communicated by the Spanish Consul at Marseilles

cember, 1874 : This department has resolved to declare foul the vessels proceeding from the said port, what-

Wherefore, vessels proceeding from Marseilles will leave, subject to strict quarantine in a foul lazaret, according to the terms of Cap. IX of the Law, and those proceeding from the other ports referred to will have to submit to three days of observation at the port of arrival, discharging their cargo in so far as it consists of "contumacious" goods, in the manner prescribed in paragraph 4 of the Royal Decree of the 22nd of July last.

I communicate the above to you for your information, and in view of the provisions contained in the 4th paragraph of the Decree of the 24th April, 1875.

(1.) Port Augusta Light and Leading Mark. THE Italian Government has given notice, dated 7th July, 1885, that on 1st August, 1885, a light will be exhibited on Cantara Point, Port Augusta :-

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 42 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles, through an are of  $8\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ , which comprises the clear passage between the shoals of Avola and Hybla.

(2.) Blaca Point-Fixed Light Exhibited.

The Austrian Government has given notice, dated 1st July, 1885, that a light is now exhibited on Blaca Point, north side of Sabioncello Peninsula, Dalmatia :-

The light is a fixed white light, which is visible through an arc of 158°, between the bearings of S. 44° E., through south, and N. 66° W.; it is elevated 55 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

INFORMATION has been received from Mr. Cotter, commanding the British steam vessel "Abington," of the existence of a coral reef lying about 18 miles E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. from Malay Reef, westward of the Outer Route to Torres Strait :---

This reef (Abington Reef) was passed by the "Abington" at 5h. P.M. 29th April, 1885, at the distance of half a mile; it appeared to extend about one mile in a north-west and south-east direction, and the sea broke slightly on its southwestern edge.
