Vienna, April 13. Last night arrived here an Express from the Imperial Camp before Camila, with an account, That upon the return of the Aga with the Emperor's Ratification of the Capitulation made with the Turkith Garifon, one of the principal Gates of the Town was, at the demand of the Imperialists, delivered up to them on Senday last; That the whole Garison was to march out the Turkith Glowing, and to be lodged in the Forrs built without the Town, where they were to continue till saturday the 15th of this Month, when they would be conducted by the Count Zichi Lieutenent-Governor of Rank, to the River Mur. to Embark on the Veslels that are to transport them to the Turkith Territories. The Letters from Ms of the 31st past, tell us, that the Rassan General Signier Antonio was marched, with the Troops under his command, into the Country of Cassan, with a design to attack Pecchia, scituated on the Contines of Albania, where tooo Arnotes and 600 Tartars were fortiving themselves. That a Party of Hongarians and Rassans, being in all not above 150 Men, had made an Excursion from Pirot, and advanced beyond Sophia, within 3 hours march of Philosoph, ranking all the Booty they could, till at last they were attacked by 1000 Terks of the Garison of Passack, but being advantageoutly possed, they defended themselves to well, that they chiliged the Enemy to retreat with the loss of 300 of their Company, and returned sate to Pirot with 28 Pritoners. Cologue, April 21. The Brandening Forces, now in Garison at Benne, will march out in 3 or 4 days; the Elector of Cologue having undertaken to keep that place, as also Keystraert and Rhinberg, with his own Troops. The Baion Spaen Licutenant-General of the Brandenburg Forces, is returned to Nais; from whence, it's believed, he will go and confer with Prince Wildlecke, who arrived the 14th Instant at Macspirich. They write from Ruis-bonne, that the Business of Saxe Lawemburg continues to give a great interruption to the Affairs of the Dyet; and that the Minister of Saxeny had declared, that the Elector his Master could not agree to the Expedient that had been proposed, of putting the Administration of that Dutchy Into the hands of the Princes Directors of the Lawer Saxony. But that Endeavours were still used to dispose his Electoral Highness to consent thereto; and that the Elector of Bavaria had particularly written to his Electoral Highness, in answer to a Letter he had received from him, on that Subject. The Advices from Hungary say, that the Turks at Canisa had, on the 9th Instant, delivered up one of the Gates of the Town to the Imperialists, who posted there too Men, and that it was agreed, that the Garison should march out the 11th with their Goods and Bararae.
