Vienna, April 13. Last night arrived here an Express from the Imperial Camp before Contifer, with an account, That upon the return of the Aga with the Emperor's Ratification of the Capitulation made with the Turkith Garifon, one of the principal Gates of the Town was, at the demand of the Imperialitis, delivered up to them on Senday last'; That the whole Garison was to march out the Turkith following, and to be lodged in the Forrs built without the Town, where they were to continue till Saturday the 15th of this Month, when they would be conducted by the Count Zichi Lieutenant-Governor of Rash, to the River Mur. to Embark on the Vesles that are to transport them to the Turkith Territories. The Letters from Miss of the 31st past, tell us, that the Rassian General Signier Antonio was marched, with the Troops under his command, into the Country of Caspous, with a design to attack Pecchio, scituated on the Contines of Albania, where 1000 Arnotes and 600 Tartars were fortifying themselves. That a Parry of Hungarians and Rascians, being in all not above 150 Men, had made an Excursion from Pirot, and advanced beyond Sophia, within 3 hours march of Philosoph, making all the Booty they could, till at last they were attacked by 1000 Tirks of the Garison of Passers, but being advantageouth posted, they desended themselves so well, that they obliged the Enemy to retreat with the loss of 2000 them Company, and returned safe to Pirot with 28 Prisoners. Cologne, April 21. The Baion Spaen Lieutenant-General of the Brandenburg Forces, is returned to Naise, from whence, it's believed, he will go and confer with Prince Wildicke, who arrived the 14th Instant at Maesfricht.
