are registered for the keeping of explosive other than gunpowder whether with or without gunpowder, hereinafter referred to as premises registered for mixed explosives, as follows:—

General Rule No. 3 of Part 1 of the Order in Council of the 27th day of November, 1875, relating to premises registered for the keeping of mixed explosives, being so much of the said Order as prescribes the maximum of explosives to be kept on premises so registered, is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof it is prescribed as follows:—

The maximum of explosives allowed to be kept on premises registered for mixed explosives shall be as follows:—

1. If the only explosive kept be one or more of the following:

(a) Gunpowder;

(b) Schultze gunpowder, E.C. sporting powder, E.C. rifle powder, or other nitro-compound adapted and intended exclusively for use in cartridges for small arms only (and hereinafter designated small arm nitro-compound);

(c) Ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6; the maximum shall be:

Small arm nitro-compound	100
or in lieu of each pound of small arm nitro-compound not so kept 2 lbs. of gunpowder:		

And, in addition, of explosive contained in ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 500

or in lieu of each pound of small arm nitro-compound not so kept 2 lbs. of gunpowder (or 4 pounds where the whole of the gunpowder is kept in a fire proof safe);

2. If the only explosive kept is Fireworks the maximum shall be:

WHEREAS, by the Manchester City Extension Act, 1885, section 19, it is enacted as follows:

"(1.) The added part of the City shall be divided into such number of Wards, with such boundaries and such number of Councillors and proportionate number of Aldermen, as may be determined by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department within three weeks after the passing of this Act.

"(2.) The Commissioner may inquire into the circumstances of the Wards immediately adjoining the added part of the City, and may, if he think fit, provide by his scheme that the area of any such ward be reduced, and that some portion or portions thereof be combined with portions of the added part of the City so as to form new Wards. Provided that the Councillors who at the commencement of this Act represent any such adjoining Ward shall hold office for the same, when reduced, for the same period as they would have held office if the existing Wards of the City had remained unaltered. Provided further that, if New Cross Ward be reduced three of the six Councillors representing that Ward may be transferred to a new Ward to be created under this Act."

And whereas section 22 of the same Act applies certain sub-sections, including sub-section 11 of section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 so as to require the Commissioner to send the scheme to the Secretary of State, to be submitted by him to Her Majesty in Council for approval.

And whereas Richard Smith, Barrister-at-Law, Esquire, duly appointed as Commissioner in pursuance of the aforesaid Manchester City Extension Act, 1885, has submitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State a Scheme in the following terms:—

"MANCHESTER CITY EXTENSION ACT, 1885.

"WHEREAS it is provided by the fifth section of the Manchester City Extension Act, 1885, that 'The boundaries of the existing city are hereby extended so as to comprise, and the city shall accordingly comprise, in addition to the existing city, the township of Harpurhey and the districts of the local boards of Bradford and Rusholme;' and it is by the nineteenth section of the said Act provided, that 'The added part of the city shall be divided into such number of wards, with such boundaries and names, and such number of councillors and proportionate number of aldermen as may be determined by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by Her

'Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department;' and it is further provided by the said nineteenth section, that 'The Commissioner may inquire into the circumstances of the wards immediately adjoining the added part of the city, and may, if he think fit, provide by his scheme that the area of any such ward be reduced, and that some portion or portions thereof be combined with portions of the added part of the city so as to form new wards.'

"And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Richard Assheton Cross, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has duly appointed me, Richard Smith, Barrister-at-Law, Esquire, a Commissioner for the purposes of the said nineteenth section of the said Act.

"And whereas I, the said Richard Smith, have inquired into the circumstances of the wards immediately adjoining the added part of the city.

"Now, therefore, I, the said Richard Smith, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act, provide and determine that the added part of the city wherewith are by me combined portions of Ardwick Ward and Saint Michael's Ward, respectively being wards immediately adjoining the added part of the city, shall be divided into three new wards, named respectively Rusholme Ward, Bradford Ward, and Harpurhey Ward, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter set forth. And I further provide and determine, that the area of the said Ardwick Ward and of the said Saint Michael's Ward respectively, shall be reduced, and that the boundaries of the said Ardwick Ward as reduced, and of the said Saint Michael's Ward as reduced, shall be as hereinafter set forth.

"And I do hereby provide and determine, that the said Rusholme Ward shall be and comprise the district of Rusholme, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, as defined in and by the Provisional Order of the General Board of Health, bearing date the 20th day of May, 1856, entitled 'Provisional Order for altering the boundaries of the district of Rusholme, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, as constituted for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1848,' and confirmed by the Public Health Supplemental Act, 1856, which said district, being a district or place having a known and defined boundary, comprised (first) the township of Rusholme, in the County Palatine of Lancaster; (secondly) the detached portion of the township of Moss Side, in the said county, which is surrounded by the township of Rusholme, the township of Chorlton-upon-Medlock, and the detached portion of the township of Newton, known as the hamlet of Kirkmanshulme, in the said county, and (thirdly) the portion of the township of Withington, in the said county (known as Fallowfield), which is within the district of Rusholme, as defined by the said Order, and which said district shall be one ward.

"And I do hereby provide and determine that the said Bradford Ward shall be and comprise the township of Bradford, being the district of Bradford, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, under an Order in Council of the 29th day of December, 1856, made under the Public Health Act, 1848, and also the township of Beswick, in the said County Palatine of Lancaster, heretofore forming part of Ardwick Ward, which said townships of Bradford and Beswick are places having known and defined boundaries, and shall be one ward.

"And I do hereby provide and determine that the said Harpurhey Ward shall be and comprise the township of Harpurhey, in the said County

Palatine of Lancaster, being a place having a known and defined boundary, and all that part of the township of Manchester, in the said County Palatine of Lancaster, within the metes and bounds following (that is to say) commencing at the point in the River Irk where the townships of Harpurhey and Manchester aforesaid meet, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the River Irk to the point where the same meets Appleton-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Appleton-street to the point where the same meets Collyhurst-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Collyhurst-road to the point where the same meets Gorton-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Gorton-street to the point where the same meets Rochdale-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Rochdale-road to the point where the same meets Collyhurst-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Collyhurst-street to the point where the same meets the boundary of the townships of Manchester and Newton, thence in a northerly direction along the boundary of the townships of Manchester and Newton to the point where the same meets the boundary of the township of Harpurhey, thence in a westerly direction along the boundary of the townships of Manchester and Harpurhey to the point at which the same meets the River Irk, at the point of commencement before described, and which said township of Harpurhey and portion of the said township of Manchester shall be one ward.

"And I do hereby provide and determine that the said Ardwick Ward as reduced shall be and comprise the township of Ardwick, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, which said township is a place having a known and defined boundary, and shall be one ward, and shall be known as Ardwick Ward.

"And I do hereby provide and determine that the said Saint Michael's Ward as reduced shall be and comprise all that part of the township of Manchester aforesaid within the metes and bounds following (that is to say): commencing at the point where Swan-street meets Oldham-road, thence along the centre of Swan-street to the point at which the same meets Miller-street, thence along the centre of Miller-street to the point at which the same meets Long Millgate, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Long Millgate to Scotland Bridge, thence along the centre of the River Irk to where the same forms a portion of the eastern boundary between the townships of Manchester and Cheetham, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the township of Manchester to the point where the same meets Appleton-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Appleton-street to the point where the same meets Collyhurst-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Collyhurst-road to the point where the same meets Gorton-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Gorton-street to the point where the same meets Rochdale-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Rochdale-road to the point where the same meets Collyhurst-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Collyhurst-street to the point where the same meets the boundary of the townships of Manchester and Newton, thence in a southerly direction along the said boundary to the point where the same meets Oldham-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Oldham-road to the point at which the same meets Swan-street, at the point of commence-

ment before described, and shall be one ward, and shall be known as Saint Michael's Ward.

"And I do hereby provide and determine that the number of Councillors to be returned in respect of the three new Wards, shall be as follows, that is to say, for Rusholme Ward three Councillors, for Bradford Ward three Councillors, and for Harpurhey Ward three Councillors, and that the proportionate number of Aldermen to be elected by the Council in respect of the said new Wards, shall be in respect of Rusholme Ward one Alderman, in respect of Bradford Ward one Alderman, and in respect of Harpurhey Ward one Alderman.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translations of Health Ordinances which have been issued by the Italian Government:—

1885.—Ordinance of Maritime Health. No. 7.

It being officially ascertained that the cases of a suspicious malady which have for some days been occurring in Marseilles have a choleraic character:

The Minister of the Interior decrees:

ART. 1. The quarantine of seven days imposed by Ordinance No. 6, of August 1st, upon arrivals from Spain, shall likewise be applied to such ships as shall from this day forth leave the French Coast on the Mediterranean or Algeria or Corsica, so long as no sickness occurs on board.

ART. 2. Steamers leaving Spain and the above-mentioned portions of France on their way to an Italian Port must go and perform quarantine in the Gulf of Asinara, where a quarantine station with a floating hospital has been purposely established under the direction of a special sanitary commission and under guard of a man-of-war. This regulation shall not be applied to the steamers which are at this moment performing quarantine in a port of the first-class.

ART. 3. Should some suspicious case of illness occur on the ships during the quarantine, the sick persons shall be at once placed on board the floating hospital to be nursed; the ships shall be subjected to a rigorous quarantine of 21 days, during which time a doctor shall, if the ship has none, be placed on board, at the expense of the ship, and it shall be his duty to see that all the hygienic measures prescribed in the quarantine regulations shall be strictly carried out, such measures, for instance, as the unpacking, washing, and disinfection of the personal effects and bedding of those on board, the destruction of things which appear compromising through dirt, the airing and disinfection of all the internal parts of the ship, and the moving of the cargo, if its nature allows.

If it shall appear that a ship in quarantine is over-crowded, the authorities shall cause some of the passengers to be placed on another ship.

ART. 4. All ships which during their voyage or on arrival shall have had cases of cholera or suspicious sickness on board, must perform quarantine at the quarantine station of Asinara, and also be subjected to the treatment laid down in the preceding article.

ART. 5. After proper performance of quarantine, ships carrying an attestation of the same on their bill of health, signed by the Sanitary Commission of Asinara, shall be received in pratique in every port of the Kingdom.

ART. 6. The hospital ship, from the moment in which it receives suspected cases on board, shall be kept in absolute preventive isolation until 21 days after the cure or death of the last patient.

ART. 7. The mails brought by ships arriving at the quarantine station of Asinara can be sent on shore even during the quarantine, but must be regularly disinfected according to the system which shall be established by the Sanitary Commission.

ART. 8. Until new orders the following articles shall not be permitted to enter the Kingdom if coming from the French continent, from Algeria or Corsica,—rags, tatters, used unwashed clothes destined for sale, lint, and selfages.

Ordinance of Health on Land.

OFFICIAL notice having arrived that suspected cases of illness of a choleraic nature have occurred in the city of Marseilles, the Minister of the Interior decrees:

ART. 1. Upon all the principal roads of communication on the frontier between Italy and France there shall at once be established a rigorous medical examination of persons who desire to enter the Kingdom, as well as their baggage.

ART. 2. If on examination it appears that these persons show no symptoms of suspicious illness, and their baggage is so clean as not to cause danger of infection, both they and their baggage shall be allowed to pass.

ART. 3. If, on the other hand, such persons are declared, in writing, by the doctor to show suspicious symptoms, or not be satisfactorily clean, or if they shall have personal effects with them so dirty as to endanger public safety, then both the individuals and their things shall be kept for observation at the station where they have arrived sufficiently long for their cure if ill, or for the cleansing of their persons, if well, and the rigorous disinfection of their clothes and other personal luggage.

ART. 4. The cleansing of their personal effects shall be carried out by subjecting these to a heat of 120 degrees centigrade, or else by exposing them to concentrated evaporation of sulphuric acid. All articles which shall turn out to be so dirty as to make it impossible to clean them, and also rags and tatters found in their baggage, shall be destroyed by burning.

ART. 5. From this day forth the following articles cannot be introduced into the Kingdom, even by land if coming from France, namely, rags, tatters, old unwashed clothes destined for sale, lint, and selfages.

Ordinance of Health on Land.

In concert with the Ministry of Public Works, the Minister of the Interior decrees:—

ART. 1. Every railway train from Ventimiglia to Savona, and from Bardonecchia to Turin shall

have a special carriage with sanitary arrangements, destined to receive such travellers as shall during the journey be attacked by suspicious illness.

ART. 2. Such carriage shall have a suitable number of sanitary attendants, and be furnished with medicines, disinfectants, and all that is necessary for the care of the sick.

ART. 3. The sick taken into the hospital carriage shall be left at the nearest station provided with a proper place for isolating them.

ART. 4. When a traveller suffering from suspicious illness is going to be left in some commune, the municipal authorities shall previously be warned by the Station Master, so as to make arrangements with the latter as to the safest way to transport the sick person to the place set apart for his reception.
