The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty. chapter thirty-nine, of the Act of the thirtyfirst and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, and of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-third day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty five, in the words following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty chapter thirtynine of the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and fourieen and of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls within the three following cures that is to say within the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Gabriel Canning Town in the county of Essex and within the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Holy Trinity Barkingroad in the same county and within the district chapelry or new parish of Saint Luke Victoria Docks in the same county all which said three cures are situate in the diorese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas the advowson of the rectory and parish church (hereinafter called the said benefice) of All Hallows London Wall in the city and diocese of London is vested in Your Majesty your heirs and successors and the same is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And whereas the respective advowsons of the said three cures (hereinafter referred to as the said benefices) of Saint Gabriel Canning Town, Holy Trinity Barking-road, and Saint Luke Victoria Docks, are vested in the Right Reverend Thomas Legh Bishop of Saint Albans in right of his See. "And whereas it has been proposed to us by

the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley, Baron Halsbury, now Lord High Chanceller of Great Britain, and by the said Thomas Legh Bishop of Saint Albans that in order to render legally practicable an apportionment of the endowments of the said benefice of All Hallows London Wall in favour of the three other benefices hereinbefore mentioned the transfer of patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed should be effected.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that such transfer of patronage as is hereinbefore mentioned is expedient, and will lend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the new parishes or districts in or in respect of which the rights of patronage to be transferred respectively arise or exist that is to say in the said consolidated chapelries or new parishes of Saint Gabriel Canning Town and Holy Trinity Barkingroad and in the said district chapelry or new parish of Saint Luke Victoria Docks.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Thomas Legh Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony of which consent he the said Bishop has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and also with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony of wh ch consent he the said Archbishop has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) we the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Saint Gabriel Canning Town Holy Trinity Barking-road and Saint Luke Victoria Docks and of each of the same benefices respectively shall be transferred from the said Thomas Legh Bishop of Saint Albans in whom as such Bishop the same advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage and presentation are now vested as aforesaid and from his successors in the same bishoprick and shall thereupon become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury or other the

Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the burgh of Edinburgh comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Dalry Edinburgh to Gorgie towards the south, the Edinburgh Suburban railway towards the west and north, and the Granton branch of the Caledonian railway towards the east,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfive, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

And We do further, by these presents, authorize and empower you, or any six or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our United Kingdom as you may deem expedient for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any six or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain, that you, or any six or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you do, with as little delay as possible report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any six or more of you, your opinion upon the several matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved George Herbert Murray, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as We may from time to time direct or approve.

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form :—

West Riding of Yorkshire. Yorkshire Registrics Act, 1884.

A T the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden by adjournment at Wakefield, in and for the West Riding of the county of York, on Monday, the 17th day of August, in the 49th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord 1885, before Basil Thomas Woodd, Esc., Chairman, William Aldam, Francis Darwin, Escuires, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the Peace ot our said Lady the Queen in the said Riding; and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses, and other Misdemeanors committed within the Riding aforesaid.

It is resolved and ordered, that by virtue of the provisions of the Yorkshire Registries Act, 1884, the following Rules be and they are hereby made by the said Justices as the County Authority for the said Riding, under and for the purposes of the said Act. Short Title.

1. These Rules may be cited as the West Riding of Yorkshire Registry Rules, 1885 (Fees).

Commencement and Duration of Rules.

2. These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1885, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1890.

Fees.

3. The fees to be paid under the Act and these Rules shall be those specified in the list of fees in the Schedule to these Rules in lieu of the fees authorized to be taken by the Yorkshire Registries Act, 1884, and the West Riding of Yorkshire Registry Rules, 1885; and such last-mentioned fees shall cease to be paid or taken.

SCHEDULE.

FEES.

N.B.-A folio contains 72 words.

Registration or enrolment of any document (including endorsement of any certificate required by section 9 of the Act), except a caveat, five shillings.

Registration or enrolment of any caveat, two shillings.

Copy or Extract.

Where copy or extract does not exceed two folios, one shilling.

For each additional folio, fourpence.

If certified, an additional fee per folio of twopence.

Map or Plan.

Copy, from two shillings to two guineas, according to labour involved.

If certified, an additional fee of two shillings.

Search, Ordinary.

In any one name, for any period not exceeding ten years, one shilling.

For every additional period of five years, sixpence.

Search, Official (including Certificate of Result).

In any one name, for any period not exceeding ten years, seven shillings and sixpence.

For every additional period of five years, two shillings and sixpence.
