PROCLAMATION respecting Quarantine to be imposed on Ships from Gibraltar.

By virtue of section 1 of the Act of the 30th March, 1885, respecting additional precautions against the importation of Asiatic cholera into Denmark, the Ministry of Justice hereby order quarantine to be imposed, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, on ships coming from or that have been in communication with ships coming from Gibraltar.
