**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of September, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Swine-Fever (Infected Circles) Order of 1884 (in this Order referred to as the Circles Order), do direct and order, and it is hereby directed and ordered, as follows:

1. The Circles Order shall, from the dates mentioned in Article 2 of this Order, apply and extend to and be in force in the District mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall continue to apply and extend to and be in force in that District until the Privy Council by further Special Order direct and order.

2.—(a.) The provisions of Article 5 (*Power to Local Authority to make Regulations*) of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such District from the date of this Order.

(b.) Except as aforesaid, the provisions of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such District from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

## (SWINE-FEVER.)

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of September, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the East Ilsley Petty Sessional Division, in the county

of Berks; (2.) the Wantage (with Lambourne) Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Berks; (3.) the Wallingford Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Berks; (4.) the Faringdon Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Berks; and (5.) the parish of Sandhurst (with Crowthorne), in the county of Berks,—which were declared by Orders of Council to be Areas infected with swine-fever, are hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her

Majesty's Postmaster - General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

*Interpretation Clause.*

1.—(1.) In this Warrant and the Schedule thereto the expressions "Parcels" and "Parcel," respectively, mean any postal packet which is posted or tendered for transmission by post as a parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

(2.) The expression "British India," includes Aden, the whole continent of India and British Burmah.

*Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.*

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by

post between the several places mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

*Rates of Postage.*

3. On all parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant there shall be charged and paid the several rates of postage respectively specified in the Schedule hereto.

*Provisions of other Warrants to apply.*

4. Every such parcel shall be subject to the provisions of the respective Warrants of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury relating to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom, and the several places mentioned in the Schedule hereto, so far as such provisions are applicable.

*Commencement of Warrant.*

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 160.)—FRANCE—WEST COAST.

(1.) *Gironde River Entrance—Alterations in Fairway Buoys.*

THE French Government has given notice, dated 21st August, 1885, that the following alterations have been made in the character of the fairway buoys marking the approaches to Passe du Nord and Passe de Sud, Gironde River entrance.

PASSE DU NORD.—The red buoy, with bell and reflector, has been replaced by a red buoy ten feet in diameter, fitted with an automatic whistle.

Position, lat. 45° 42' N., long. 1° 23' W.

PASSE DE SUD.—The conical buoy has been replaced by a pillar buoy, coloured red and black

in horizontal stripes, and fitted with a bell and reflector.

Position, lat. 45° 30' N., long. 1° 16' W.

SPAIN—SOUTH COAST—CADIZ BAY.

(2.) *Occulting Green Light on Los Cochinos.*

The Spanish Government has given notice, that on 8th July, 1885, a light was exhibited (experimentally at first) from the beacon on Los Cochinos, south side of entrance to Cadiz Bay :—

The light is an occulting green light every minute, visible twenty seconds and eclipsed forty seconds; it should be seen in clear weather from a distance of three miles.

The beacon has been increased in height, and is

now 23 feet high; the illuminating apparatus is placed about 6 feet above its summit.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of Holcombe, in the county of Somerset, and in the diocese of Bath and Wells, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Andrew.

And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells, as such Bishop, the Right Honourable Hedworth Hylton, Baron Hylton, the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Holcombe, and the Reverend Walter Eugene Whitaker, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Rector or Incumbent of the same rectory, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the fourth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Holcombe that the said new church of Saint Andrew, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also dedicated to Saint Andrew) of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instrument under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Arthur Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells, of the said Hedworth Hylton, Baron Hylton, and of the said Walter Eugene Whitaker, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Andrew, situate within the said parish of Holcombe, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Andrew as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Holcombe in lieu of the said old parish church

of Saint Andrew as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Andrew so hereby substituted had been originally the parish church of the same parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Andrew as aforesaid) of the said parish of Holcombe, or of or belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Andrew (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Holcombe) and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said Arthur Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said Hedworth Hylton, Baron Hylton, and the said Walter Eugene Whitaker have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals this sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
