T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 14th day of October, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely), —(1.) so much of the borough of Nottingham as is comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Chapel Bar on the north, Park Row on the west, Postern-street on the south, and St. James's-street on the east; and (2.) so much of the borough of Nottingham as is comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Milton-street (Bulwell) on the north, Hempshill-lane on the south, Coventry-road on the east, and the Bulwell Brick Company's Works on the west, —which were declared by Order of Council to be Areas infected with swinc-fever, are hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with swine-fever.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin, transmitting copy and translation of new German Customs regulations affecting the tare rates on mineral oils imported in casks, which will come into force on the 1st November next. The following is the substance of these regulations:—

When mineral oils are imported in casks, which under the tariff are chargeable with a higher duty than the liquid they contain, such casks will, unless they are intended for re-exportation under control of the Customs authorities, be charged with a special duty according to their own weight, which duty will be equivalent to the difference in the duties fixed in the tariff for mineral oils and for casks. If the importer prefers not to allow the true weight of the casks to be ascertained, their "duty-weight" will be fixed at 20 per cent. of the weight taken for the assessment of the duty on the oil, i.e., the weight of cask and liquid together. Should the importer desire to re-export the empty casks with drawback, proper notice must be given when the oil is introduced into general commerce.

His Excellency further states in his Despatch, that in accordance with a recent decision of the Bundesrath, the following Custom-houses have been fixed as the only places at which woollen yarns, classed under the category No. 41, c. 2, of the new German tariff, i.e., "hard combed yarn over 20 centimetres long, as Genappe mohair and alpaca," can be declared for duty, viz.:—

I. The Prussian Head Custom-house for foreign goods at Berlin.

II. The Prussian Customs Offices at Elberfeld, at the Ritterhausen and Steinbeck Railway Stations.

III. The Saxon Custom-house at Leipsig.

THE Proclamation issued on the 23rd of June, 1884, by the Ministry of Justice, prescribing that the provisions contained in Clause II, section 1, of the Act of the 2nd of July, 1880, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into Denmark, should come into force with respect to ships coming from or that have been in communication with London, as well as those that have received any persons on board during the voyage from a vessel from London is hereby revoked.

This Proclamation shall at once take effect.

1885.—Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 13.
The Minister of the Interior, to facilitate the sailing traffic between Sicily and the Adriatic, as concerns the existing quarantine regulations, decrees:—

ART. 1. A quarantine station is established at the entrance of the Lagoon of Venice, near the Diga Spignon, within the anchorage indicated by quarantine buoys, under the direction of proper sanitary surveillance and a Commission appointed ad hoc

ART. 2. Sailing ships with a clean passage arriving from Sicily and the adjacent islands, and bound for a point of the Adriatic Coast will be admitted to undergo observation in this place,

excepting ships from the Gulf of Palermo, which are still subject to the existing regulations.
