(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 20th day of October, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Conneil, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Helsby, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the junction of the river Mersey with the Holpool gutter, by the said gutter and Hornsmill brook to Hornsmill, thence across the Chester high-road, along Peck-lane and the Helsby and Alvanley-road to Alvanley village, from Alvanley village by Toothill-road past Woodhouses to the Chester and Frodsham highway, by the said highway to its junction with Hatley-lane, thence by Hatley-lane under the London and North-Western Railway to Long Length-lane, by Long Length-lane across Lordship-lane and lane to Moorditchlane, by Moorditch-lane and the lane leading to the river Mersey Embankment, thence to the river Mersey, and along the river Mersey to Holpool gutter aforesaid,-which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

NORTH ISLAND-NORTH-EAST COAST. (2.) Reported Rock Eastward of Poor Knights  $\emph{\textbf{I}}$ slands.

The Government of New Zealand has given notice, that the master of the brig "Vision" has reported, that when on the voyage from Sydney to Auckland, he passed within 60 yards of a sunken rock lying with the Northern of Poor Knights Islands bearing W. by N. approximately, distant about 15 miles:

He states that this rock (Vision Rock) appeared to have about 3 to 4 fathoms water over it, and to be about 50 feet square, with dark crevices; the sea did not break on the rock, but there was a slight ripple along the edge, with much discoloured water around.

Note.—From the doubtful nature of the report, the existence of this danger cannot be considered certain. Vessels navigating in the vicinity should however exercise great caution.

Percy Isles. Fixed and Flashing Light on South-Western Pine Islet.

THE Government of Queensland has given notice, thas on 17th July, 1885, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse crected on the summit of the South-western Pine Islet, Percy Isles :-

The light is a fixed and flashing white light, showing a fixed light for a period of one minute, and a white flash preceded and followed by a short eclipse—the whole series occupying two minutes. It is elevated 180 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 20 miles.

A small sector of red light is shown to the southward, the centre passing over the position of Normanby Rock.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the second order.

The lighthouse, 40 feet high, is circular in shape, and painted stone colour.
