(PORT OF SOUTHAMPTON,—APPROVAL OF LAND-ING-PLACES FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 23rd day of October, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 and 1884, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following parts of the Port of Southampton as Landing-Places for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

Landing-Place No. 1.

All that space in the Southampton Docks within the borough of Southampton, included within a line commencing at a point at a distance of about three hundred feet in an easterly direction from the Police Lodge situate at the entrance of the Docks in the Canute-road and thence running in a westerly direction along the boundary wall unto the said Police Lodge and thence at the back thereof for a distance of about forty feet, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of about four hundred feet to the north-east corner of the Close Dock, thence along the eastern quay of the said Close Dock for a distance of about two hundred and thirty-seven feet, thence in an easterly direction along the entrance to the said Close Dock for a distance of about two hundred and sixty feet, thence in a northerly direction along the west quay of the Open Dock for a distance of about three hundred and ten feet, and thence in a northerly direction for a distance of about five hundred and twenty feet to the point first-mentioned, all which space is coloured red on the plan of Southampton Docks deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Southampton.

Landing-Place No. 2.

All that space in the Southampton Docks within the borough of Southampton, included within a line commencing at a point at a distance of about ninety-two feet in an easterly direction from the north-west corner of the Open Dock and running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of about thirty-five feet to the Export Warehouse, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance

of about four hundred feet by the wall of the said Export Warehouse, thence in an easterly direction in a line parallel with and seventy-five feet from the north wall of the Open Dock for a distance of about five hundred and fifty feet, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of about one hundred and ninety feet to the south-west corner of the Timber Pond, thence in an easterly direction for a distance of about two hundred and twenty feet, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of about six hundred and sixty feet, thence in an easterly direction along the Jetty for a distance of about one hundred and fifty feet, thence in a southerly direction about thirty-five feet along the end of the said Jetty, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of about three hundred feet along the edge of the Jetty and Dock Entrance, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of about four hundred and seventyfive feet along the north-east quay of the Open Dock, thence in a westerly direction along the north quay of the said Open Dock for a distance of about six hundred and forty feet, and thence in a south-westerly direction along the north-west quay of the Open Dock to the point first-mentioned, all which space is coloured yellow on the said plan and copy deposited as aforesaid.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at New Orleans, stating that the Louisiana Board of Health had resolved-

"That the Governor of the State be requested to issue his Proclamation to the effect that, on and after the 10th day of October, 1885, the period of detention of vessels from infected Gulf and Caribbean ports be reduced to three days, provided said vessels are free from infectious or contagious diseases and have a clean health record during the voyage, and that free pratique be granted all vessels from regions declared quarantinable upon the completion of sanitation.

"That on and after the 1st day of November, 1885, quarantine be declared raised as regards all ports except such as may be or may become infected with cholora."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Constantinople, transmitting a circular issued by the Ottoman Board of Health, of which the following is a translation: - "1 th October, 1885. -The Council of Health, taking into consideration the abatement of the cholera epidemic, has decided that the quarantine on arrivals from Spain, Gibraltar, France, Corsica, and Italy shall be ten days instead of twelve.

Arrivals from the above-mentioned countries in Ottoman ports with clean bills of health obtained in a port of a country free from infection will be admitted to free pratique after a medical visit, provided that a period of twentyfour days instead of thirty has elapsed since their departure from an infected port.

Vessels now undergoing quarantine will have the advantage of these arrangements."

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Mayor Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Bath, acting by the Council as the Local Authority, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations, the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said city; and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car. The "Company" shall mean the Patent Cable Tramways Corporation Limited. "Tramways" shall mean the tramways laid down within the said city. "The Local Authority" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Bath acting by the Council.

The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight

miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a

less distance than fifty yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room and to whose admission no valid objection can be made. Provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or a terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction

of two or more streets or roads.

6. The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall with reasonable despatch cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

8. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and

Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

9. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the
