rags, unwashed old clothes for sale, used bed-linen,

selveges, and lint remains in force.

The Prefects of the Provinces of Turin, Cureo, and Portomanrizio are charged with the execution of this Ordinance; the other Prefects of the Kingdom will advise the Syndics of it as may be necessary for their guidance.

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 15. In order to facilitate the fulfilment of the quarantine regulations in force for the small sailing vessels which ply between Sicily and the mainland, and for which at the present season the passage of the Strait of Bonifacio, in order to arrive at Asinara, offers difficulties, the Minister of the Interior decrees:

Sailing ships, with a registered net tonnage of not more than 50 tons, arriving from the harbours and landing-places of Sicily and the adjacent islands (except from the Gulf of Palermo) without a case of sickness during the passage, will be admitted, on and after to-day's date, to undergo quarantine in the station for that purpose in the Gulf of Aranci.

The Prefect of Sassari is charged with the
