THE following places will, until further notice, be considered as infected with cholera:-

In France, harbours on the Mediterranean and in the department of Finisterre: Spain, Sicily, Japan, Cochin China, East India Island, East Indies, Harbours in the Red Sea, Syria, Uru-

guayana, in Brazil.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and destined for Norwegian ports must be directed by the pilots to the quarantine depôt at Christianssand; in other harbours captains expose themselves to keeping the patients on board and remaining in quarantine themselves.

This notice takes the place of the Order from this Department, dated last September 14 (No. 6, 1885), and is forwarded to whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the

twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, We, the Local Government Board, in consequence of the prevalence of Cholera in certain parts of Spain, made regulations with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags from that country, and declared that such regulations should be in force until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five:
