HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs an Act of Congress relating to the Immigration of Persons under contract to perform Labour in the United States, of which the following is a copy :-

(Public-No. 52.)
An Act to prohibit the Importation and Migration of Foreigners and Aliens under contract or agreement to perform Labour in the United States, its Territories, and the District of Columbia.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, That from and after the passage of this Act, it shall be unlawful for any person, company, partnership, or corporation, in any manner whatsoever, to prepay the transportation, or in any way assist or encourage the importation or migration of any alien or aliens, any

foreigner or foreigners, into the United States, its territories, or the district of Columbia, under contract or agreement, parol or special, express or implied, made previous to the importation or migration of such alien or aliens, foreigner or foreigners, to perform labour or service of any kind in the United States, its territories, or the district of Columbia.

Sec. 2. That all contracts or agreements, express or implied, parol or special, which may hereafter be made by and between any person, company, partnership, or corporation, and any foreigner or foreigners, alien or aliens, to perform labour or service, or having reference to the performance of labour or service by any person in the United States, its territories, or the district of Columbia, previous to the migration or importation of the person or persons whose labour or service is contracted for into the United States, shall be utterly void and of no effect.

SEC. 3. That for every violation of any of the provisions of section 1 of this Act, the person, partnership, company, or corporation violating the same by knowingly assisting, encouraging, or soliciting the migration or importation of any alien or aliens, foreigner or foreigners, into the United States, its territories, or the district of Columbia, to perform labour or service of any kind under contract or agreement, express or implied, parol or special, with such alien or aliens, foreigner or foreigners, previous to becoming residents or citizens of the United States, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the sum of one thousand dollars, which may be sued for and recovered by the United States, or by any person who shall first bring his action therefor, including any such alien or foreigner who may be a party to any such contract or agreement, as debts of like amount are now recovered in the Circuit Courts of the United States, the proceeds to be paid into the Treasury of the United States, and separate suits may be brought for each alien or foreigner being a party to such contract or agreement aforesaid. And it shall be the duty of the District Attorney of the proper district to prosecute every such suit at the expense of the United States.

SEC. 4. That the master of any vessel who shall knowingly bring within the United States on any such vessel, and land, or permit to be landed, from any foreign port or place, any alien, labourer, mechanic, or artisan, who, previous to embarkation on such vessel, had entered into contract or agreement, parol or special, express or implied, to perform labour or service in the United States, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour, and, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars for each and every such alien, labourer, mechanic, or artisan so brought as aforesaid, and may also be imprisoned for a term not exceeding six months.

Sec. 5. That nothing in this Act shall be so construed as to prevent any citizen or subject of any foreign country temporarily residing in the United States, either in private or official capacity, from engaging under contract, or otherwise, persons not residents or citizens of the United States to act as private secretaries, servants, or domestics, for such foreigner temporarily residing in the United States as aforesaid, nor shall this Act be so construed as to prevent any person or persons, partnership or corporation, from engaging under contract or agreement skilled workman in foreign countries to perform labour in the United States in or upon any new industry not at present established in the United States: Provided that skilled labour for that purpose cannot be other-

wise obtained, nor shall the provisions of this Act apply to professional actors, artists, lecturers, or singers, nor to persons employed strictly as personal or domestic servants: Provided that nothing in this Act shall be construed as prohibiting any individual from assisting any member of his family, or any relative or personal friend, to migrate from any foreign country to the United States for the purpose of settlement

SEC. 6. That all laws or parts of laws conflicting herewith be, and the same are, hereby repealed.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 192.)—China Sea.—Pescadores Islands. Shoal Ground Southward of Litsitah Point.

INFORMATION has been received of the existence of shoal ground extending southward of Litsitah Point, Fisher Island:—

In April, 1885, the French ironclad "Triomphante" struck on a rock southward of Litsitah Point, and from soundings subsequently taken in the vicinity, it was ascertained that shoal rocky ground extends half-a-mile southward of that Point.

In May, 1885, the British steam vessel "Welcome" also struck on a rock southward of Litsitah Point, and sustained considerable damage, it is considered that this rock is identical with that on which the "Triomphante" struck.

Note.—Vessels should not pass southward of Litsitah Point within the distance of about one

NOTICE TO MARINERS. (No. 193.)—SHETLAND ISLES.

Continuance of Experimental Fog Signal on Fair Isle.

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners, No. 29, of 21st February, 1885, and No. 94, of 16th May, 1885, on the establishment, on trial, for a period of about six months, of a rocket fog signal on Fair Isle.

The Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have given further notice, dated 21st October, 1885, that the signal will be continued in operation for a further period of at least six months from 8th November, 1885.

A rocket will be fired every ten minutes, during fog or thick snow showers. These rockets will explode with a loud report at the height of about 800 feet above the sea.

Two sizes of rockets are intended to be used,the smaller, with 4 oz. charges, will be used during fogs when the weather is calm; the larger, with 12 oz. charges, when the weather is thick and stormy, or during heavy snow showers.

Note.—The continuance of this fog signal for the above-mentioned period is experimental merely, and mariners are cautioned that they must not depend upon the certainty of hearing the warning signal when used, as the rockets are to be fired from the centre of the isle, which is about 3 miles long in a north and south direction, with a greatest breadth of 11 miles.

Fixed Light at River Real Entrance.

THE Brazilian Government has given notice, that on 15th October, 1885, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse at River Real Entrance:

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 70 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The lighthouse, 69 feet high and quadrangular in shape (painted white), contains the keeper's dwelling, and is provided with a mast and yards for signalling purposes.

Approximate position on Admiralty Charts, lat. 11° 27′ S., long. 37° 22′ W.
