

7. To authorise trustees and others to invest in the said stock, and to confer all necessary and usual powers on the Corporation for and in relation to the creation and issue of stock.

8. The Bill will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which will interfere with any of its objects, and confer other rights and privileges, and will repeal, vary, or extend, so far as may be necessary, the provisions of, among other local Acts, "The Salford Improvement Act, 1862," "The Salford Improvement Act, 1867," "The Salford Improvement Act, 1870," "The Salford Improvement Act, 1871," "The Salford Tramways and Improvement Act, 1875," "The Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 8) Act, 1882," "The Salford Corporation Tramways Order, 1885," and any other Acts or Orders relating directly or indirectly to the Corporation, and of "The Manchester Ship Canal Act, 1885," and any other Act or Order which would in any way interfere with the objects of the Bill.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 21st day of December next.

Wrexham Gas.

(Extension of Gas Works; Additional Lands; Use of Lands for Gas Storage and other Purposes; Additional Capital; Provisions as to Manufacture and Supply of Gas Stoves and other Apparatus; Further Provisions as to Ordinary Meetings of the Company; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts; and other Purposes.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made in Parliament in the ensuing session, by the Wrexham Gas Light Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), for all or some of the following objects and purposes, that is to say:—

To enable the Company, on the lands hereinafter described, acquired, or to be acquired by them by agreement, or on some of such lands, or on some part or parts thereof respectively, to erect, construct, make, and maintain, and from time to time alter, improve, enlarge, extend, renew, and discontinue works for the manufacture and storage of gas, and for the manufacture, conversion, utilization, and distribution of residual products resulting from the manufacture of gas, and to manufacture and to store gas, and to manufacture, convert, utilize, distribute, and store such materials and residual products, and to make such roads, bridges, approaches, works, and conveniences, in connection with such gas and other works, as may be necessary or convenient, and as the Company may think fit, and to extend and make applicable to, and to enable the Company to exercise in respect of the said lands or any of them, or any part or parts thereof, all or some of the powers and provisions of the Wrexham Gas Act, 1870, as altered, amended, and enlarged by the intended Act.

The lands before referred to are wholly situate within the township of Wrexham Regis, in the town of Wrexham, in the county of Denbigh, and are bounded as follows (that is to say):—

(1) A piece of land abutting on and bounded on the north by the road or street called Rivulet-road; on the west, by land belonging

or reputed to belong to the Wrexham Gas Light Company, and secondly described in the Schedule to the Wrexham Gas Act, 1870; on the east, by a road now in course of formation, between Albert-street and Rivulet-road; and on the south by the road or street called Green Bank, and which piece of land comprises an area of 1 acre, 1 rood, and 16 perches, or thereabouts.

(2) A piece of land abutting on and bounded on the north by the road or street called Rivulet-road; on the west, by the road above-mentioned, now in course of formation; on the east, abutting upon and bounded by the road or street called Derby-road; and on the south, by land belonging or reputed to belong to the representatives of the late Peter Walker, and by property belonging or reputed to belong to the Rev. Robert Middleton, and by the road or street called Green Bank, and which piece of land comprises an area of 2 acres and 12 perches or thereabouts.

To empower the Company to retain and hold, and from time to time to sell, exchange, let on lease, or otherwise dispose of any lands at any time acquired or held by them, which they may not for the time being require for the purposes of their undertaking.

To define the undertaking of the Company, and the lands to be used for the manufacture of gas and residual products, and the storage of gas.

To empower the Company for the purposes of their undertaking, other than the manufacture and storage of gas and the manufacture or conversion of residual products, to acquire by agreement, take on lease, and hold other lands, houses, buildings, and other property or rights or easements in, over, or through lands, houses, buildings, and other property.

To vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would interfere with any of the objects or purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

To authorise the Company to raise additional capital by the creation and issue of new shares or stock, attaching, if the Company think fit, to such shares or stock, or any part thereof, a preference or priority of dividend over the existing or ordinary shares of the Company, or other special privileges, and, by borrowing on mortgage or bond or otherwise, and by the creation and issue of debenture stock, or by any such methods, and upon such terms and conditions as the intended Act shall define or Parliament may prescribe, and to apply such additional capital for the purposes of the intended Act, and the general purposes of the undertaking of the Company, and also to authorise the Company to apply for all or any part of the purposes of the intended Act any funds and capital now belonging to or authorised to be raised by them.

To authorise the Company to manufacture; purchase, provide, supply, sell, let, or hire, use, and otherwise deal in gas and other fittings, engines, stoves, ranges, baths, pipes, and other apparatus, for the warming and ventilating of houses, buildings, or other places; for the cooking of food and all other purposes for which gas can or may be used; and to levy and recover rents and charges for the sale, supply, letting, or use of such fittings, engines, stoves, ranges, baths, pipes, and other apparatus, and to exempt the same from distress or execution.
