NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 220.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—SARDINIA—
NORTH COAST.—ASINARA ISLAND.

(1.) *Temporary Light-Vessels in Reale Roadstead.*
THE Italian Government has given notice, that on 13th October, 1885, two light-vessels were temporarily placed to mark the south-eastern and north-western limits of Neri Shoal, Reale Roadstead:—

The outer light is a fixed red light, elevated 49 feet above the sea.

The light-vessel, painted red and white in horizontal bands, is moored in 7½ fathoms water, with Trabucato Tower bearing N. 70° E., distant about one mile.

Position, lat. 41° 2½' N., long. 8° 19' E.

The inner light is a fixed red light, elevated 49 feet above the sea.

The light-vessel, painted red and white in horizontal bands, is moored in 19 feet water, with Trabucato Tower bearing S. 75½° E., distant about 1½ miles.

These light-vessels are placed with the two beacons on Neri Shoal in line. Mariners should not pass between them.

(2.) *Milazzo—Light-Vessel Marking New Mole.*
Also, that on 1st November, 1885, a light-vessel would be placed to mark the extension of the Mole at Port Milazzo:—

The light is a fixed red light.

The light-vessel is moored in the line of direction of the New Mole, and about 130 yards distant from the lighthouse on the Old Mole Head.

TUNIS—GULF OF KABES.

(3.) *Particulars of Light-Vessel near Djerba Island.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 205 (1), of 19th October, 1881, on a light-vessel (named "Mater"), having been placed near Djerba Island, south side of entrance to the Gulf of Kabes:—

The following particulars have been received from Commander Domville, H.M.S. "Condor":—
The light, fixed white, is elevated about 40 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

The light-vessel, with one mast, and painted black, is moored with the following bearings:—

Fort on Djerba Island, S. 12° W.

Bordj Djerib, S. 68° W.

Position, lat. 38° 57½' N., long. 10° 51' E.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of West Wrattling, in the county of Cambridge, and in the diocese of Ely, one capital sum of fifty-six pounds and ten shillings, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of improving the water supply for the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of West Wrattling.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this nineteenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of the Holy Trinity, Hinckley, in the county of Leicester, and in the diocese of Peterborough, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of ninety-two pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
