Penarth Promenade and Landing Pier.
(Application for Provisional Order for the Revival of the Penarth Promenade and Landing Pier Order, 1881.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December next, by Ernest Albert Harrison Ainsworth, of No. 28, Martin's-lane, in the City of London, gentleman (hereinafter called the undertaker), to make a Provisional Order pursuant to "The General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861," and "The General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, Amendment Act," for the revival of and to confer upon the undertaker all and singular the powers conferred by the Penarth Promenade and Landing Pier Order, 1881; and for the revival and renewal of the provisions contained in the said Order.

The works authorised by the said Order,

which are wholly at Penarth, in the parish of Penarth, in the county of Glamorgan, comprise:—

- (a.) A pier, commencing on the esplanade at a point 230 feet, measured from the northern end of the esplanade in a southerly direction, and 60 feet from the northern end of a block of houses known as the Balcony-villas, and extending seawards in an easterly direction not more than 640 feet from high water mark.
- (b.) The construction and maintenance of such approach roads as may be found necessary for obtaining access to such pier.
- (c.) The making, providing, and maintaining in connection with the aforesaid works, or any of them, or any part or parts thereof respectively, of all necessary and convenient shipping and landing places, roads, footpaths, depôts, warehouses, sheds, toll houses, toll gates or bars, custom houses, weigh-bridges, weighing machines, cranes, hydraulic lifts, buoys, moorings, sewers, drains, and other works and conveniences.

And notice is hereby further given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant plans and sections of the proposed pier and works, and a copy of the notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited with the clerk of the peace for the county of Glamorgan, at his office at Cardiff, at the Custom-house, Penarth, and at the Board of Trade, Whitehall-gardens, London. On and after the 23rd day of December next, printed copies of the proposed Provisional Order will be furnished at the price one shilling each to all persons applying for the same at the offices of the undersigned.
