

To enable the Company to run over and use any private railways, wagon-ways, tramways, or sidings which may be connected with the intended railways and works, or any railway or works to be run over and used by the Company, and to enable the Company on the one hand, and the owners of and persons interested in any such railways, wagon-ways, or sidings on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect agreements as to the use of the same by the Company, either in perpetuity or for such term or terms of years as may be agreed upon.

To make provisions as to the opening and use of the opening or swing-bridge constructed by the Tyne Improvement Commissioners across the River Tyne at Newcastle, and to limit, fix, and define the dues or charges to be paid in respect of passing the said bridge by vessels and cargoes destined for or coming from any of the works of the Company, and to provide for, commuting the same, and conferring exemptions therefrom.

To enable the Company to remove and alter the bridge carrying the said Redheugh Line of the North Eastern Railway across the River Team at Dunston, in the township of Whickham, and parish of Whickham, and in the township of Gateshead and parish and borough of Gateshead, and to construct an opening or swing bridge in the same situation instead thereof.

To alter and amend so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the intended Act the following local and personal Acts, viz.: 17 & 18 Vict., cap. 211; 26 & 27 Vict., cap. 122; 28 Vict., cap. 111; 28 & 29 Vict., cap. 368; 33 Vict., cap. 7; 33 & 34 Vict., cap. 105; 37 & 38 Vict., cap. 105, and 47 & 48 Vict., cap. 58, and any other Act or Acts relating to the North Eastern Railway Company, also "The River Tyne Improvement Act, 1850," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1852," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1857," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1859," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1861," "Tyne General Ferry Act, 1862," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1865," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1866," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1867," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1870," "The Tyne Coal Dues Act, 1872," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1872," "The Tyne Improvement Commission Act, 1875," "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1877," and "The Tyne Improvement Act, 1881," and any other Act relating to the River Tyne or Tyne Improvement Commissioners.

The Bill will vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which may interfere with its objects, and it will incorporate with itself, with variations and modifications, all or some of the provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845;" "The Companies Clauses Acts, 1863 and 1869;" "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869;" "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845;" "The Railways Clauses Act, 1863;" and "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847;" and will or may exempt the Company and their undertaking from such of the provisions of those Acts as may not be considered applicable or necessary.

Duplicate plans and sections showing the lines, situation, and levels of the said intended railways and works, and the lands, houses, and other property which may be taken for the purposes thereof, with a Book of Reference to such plans, and an Ordnance map with the line of the said intended railways and works delineated thereon, and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will on or before the

30th day of November instant be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Durham, at his office in the City of Durham; and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and Book of Reference as relates to each parish or extra-parochial place, in or through which the said works are intended to be made, or will be situate, with a copy of this Notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection, in the case of each such parish, with the parish clerk thereof, at his residence; and in the case of any such extra-parochial place, with the parish clerk of some parish immediately adjoining thereto, at his residence.

Printed copies of the intended Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 21st day of December next.

Rowley Regis and Blackheath Gas.

(Dissolution and Re-incorporation of the Rowley Regis and Blackheath Gas Company, Limited; Power to maintain Works for manufacture and conversion of Gas or other lighting or heating Agent, and to supply the same within the places of Rowley Village, Blackheath, Perry's-lake, Knowle, Tividale, Portway, and all other places within the parish of Rowley Regis, in the county of Stafford, excepting Cradley-heath, Reddal-hill, and Old-hill; Power to purchase lands by agreement; to break up roads, &c., to hold patent rights, &c., to deal in Coal, Coke, &c., and to supply Meters, Fittings, and Apparatus; Regulation of Capital; Additional Capital; Borrowing Powers; Agreements with Public Bodies, Companies, &c.; Rates, Rents, and Charges; Sales, Lease or Exchange of Lands; Incorporation and amendment of Acts, and other powers.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that an application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill for effecting the purposes, or some of the purposes, following, that is to say:—

1. To dissolve the Rowley Regis and Blackheath Gas Company, Limited, hereinafter called the "Limited Company," to cancel or annul their memorandum and articles of association; and so far as necessary or expedient to provide for their winding up.

2. To incorporate into a Company (hereinafter called "the Company") the proprietors of the Limited Company, or some of them, with or without other persons and corporations.

3. To vest in the Company all the undertaking, works, lands, buildings, property, stock, plant, interests, rights, powers, privileges, easements, licences, and agreements, of the Limited Company.

4. To declare, define, and regulate the undertaking, capital, and borrowing powers, and to make provision for the regulation and management of the affairs and proceedings of the Company, and to authorise them to raise additional capital by borrowing on mortgage or otherwise, and to create and issue debenture stock.
