T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of December, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the Newbury (with Hungerford) Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Berks,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swinc-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swinc-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

(PORT OF LONDON (THAMES HAVEN).—AP-PROVAL OF LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 and 1884, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of London as a Landing-Place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space in the parish of Fobbing, in the county of Essex, situate on the premises of the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company at Thames Haven, bounded by a line commencing at a point at the edge of the river Thames and ten feet or thereabouts to the south of the southeast corner of the Station Buildings, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty-six feet or thereabouts, thence

forty feet or thereabouts to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of Thames Haven Landing-Place deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk of the City of London, and the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Consul-General for Russia an intimation that, in consequence of the appearance of cholera at Tunis and at Concarneau, Puilvinec, Audierne, and Kerhorre, near Brest, the Russian Government have ordered :-

1. That vessels with cargo from Tunis coming into Black Sea ports shall be subject to the sanitary measures which were published in the London Gazette of the 14th July last, as having been adopted for vessels from Spain.

2. That vessels with cargo from the above-named French ports shall not be permitted to enter the Russian Baltic ports unless they should have undergone a satisfactory observation at one of the foreign quarantine stations, and also that a strict sanitary inspection shall be made of all vessels

with clean bills of health arriving from the other ports of the north-western coast of France.

Vessels arriving in Russian Black Sea ports from Marseilles with clean bills of health are only subjected to strict medical inspection, instead of seven days observation.
