(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of December, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the Newbury (with Hungerford) Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Berks,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

(PORT OF LONDON (THAMES HAVEN).—APPROVAL OF LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of December, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 and 1884, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of London as a Landing-Place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine :

All that space in the parish of Fobbing, in the county of Essex, situate on the premises of the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company at Thames Haven, bounded by a line commencing at a point at the edge of the river Thames and ten feet or thereabouts to the south of the south-east corner of the Station Buildings, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty-six feet or thereabouts, thence

in an easterly direction for a distance of fourteen feet or thereabouts, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of ten feet or thereabouts thence round the Landing-Stage extending into the river Thames for a distance of one hundred and eighty-seven feet or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of seventy feet or thereabouts, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of fifty feet or thereabouts, thence in an easterly direction for a distance of twenty feet or thereabouts, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of seven hundred and twenty-two feet or thereabouts following the side of the ditch, thence in a curved line in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally south-westerly direction for a distance of ninety-eight feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally westerly direction for a distance of eighty-two feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and ten feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally south-westerly direction for a distance of seventy-eight feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of sixty feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally westerly direction for a distance of ninety-seven feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally northerly direction for a distance of sixty-three feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of ninety feet or thereabouts, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of nine hundred and forty-five feet or thereabouts, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of forty-five feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of eight hundred and eighty-eight feet or thereabouts, thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts, thence in a curved line in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of two hundred and fifteen feet or thereabouts, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of two hundred and forty-five feet or thereabouts, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of ten feet or thereabouts, thence in a southerly direction alongside the Station Buildings for a distance of

forty feet or thereabouts to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of Thames Haven Landing-Place deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk of the City of London, and the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Consul-General for Russia an intimation that, in consequence of the appearance of cholera at Tunis and at Concarneau, Pailvinec, Audierne, and Kerhorre, near Brest, the Russian Government have ordered:—

1. That vessels with cargo from Tunis coming into Black Sea ports shall be subject to the sanitary measures which were published in the London Gazette of the 14th July last, as having been adopted for vessels from Spain.

2. That vessels with cargo from the above-named French ports shall not be permitted to enter the Russian Baltic ports unless they should have undergone a satisfactory observation at one of the foreign quarantine stations, and also that a strict sanitary inspection shall be made of all vessels

with clean bills of health arriving from the other ports of the north-western coast of France.

Vessels arriving in Russian Black Sea ports from Marseilles with clean bills of health are only subjected to strict medical inspection, instead of seven days observation.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer:—

Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell.  
To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell, in the county of Surrey:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows:—

“The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination Officer such salary or remuneration, and such only, as the Local Government Board may direct or approve, whether for ordinary duties or for occasional services; and such salary or remuneration may be increased or reduced as that Board may from time to time direct or approve.”

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso:—

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unfore-

seen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Parish.
