## (Swine-Fever.)

AT ine Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of December, 1885.
By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

TTHE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in tham vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered. as follows:

1. The following Area (namely), -the Newbury (with Hungerford) Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Berks,-which was declared by Order of Council dated the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swinc-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swinefever.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

IVHE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1578 and 1884 , and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of London as a LandingPlace for foreign animals not subject to slanghter or quarantine:

All that space in the parish of Fobbing, in the county of Essex, situate on the premises of the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company at Thames Haven, bounded by a line commencing at a point at the edge of the river Thames and ten feet or thereabouts to the south of the southeast corner of the Station Buildings, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty-six foct or thereabouts; thence
