PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855," it was enacted, that in any case in which any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon had been, or should be thereafter erected or placed on or near the coasts of any British possession, by or with the consent of the Legislative Authority of such possession, Her Majesty might, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof to be paid by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom as Her Majesty might deem reasonable, and might in like manner from time to time increase, diminish; or repeal such dues; and that from the time specified in such Order for the commencement of the dues thereby fixed, increased, or diminished the same should be leviable throughout Her Majesty's dominions in manner thereafter mentioned:

And whereas a lighthouse was, by and with the consent of the Legislative Authority of the Colony of Newfoundland, erected on Cape Race, in the said Colony, and a light exhibited therein; and a steam fog whistle has also been erected at that station:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the dues to be paid in respect of ships passing and deriving benefit from the said light and fog signal, as in the said Order in Council appearing, should be one-eighth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such ship:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the dues in respect of the said lighthouse and fog signal should cease to be levied:

Now therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct, that on and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, all dues hitherto leviable in respect of the said lighthouse and steam fog whistle upon Cape Race, shall cease to be levied.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

NORTH HARBORNE.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of North Harborne, in the county of Stafford; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

NORTON-JUXTA-MALTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church cemetery of Norton-juxta-Malton in the county of York

after the thirty-first December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed in stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(d.) In such reserved grave spaces (as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

SOUTH DARLEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of South Darley in the county of Derby; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, except as follows:

(a.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-eighth day of January next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said twenty-eighth day of January.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at South Eston, in the Petty Sessional Division of Langbaugh North, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the railway leading to the Eston Mines, on the east by a fence at the east side of the California Gardens, Trustee Gardens, Broughton Gardens, and Kitty Nips Gardens, on the south by a fence at the south side of Jacksons Gardens, and on the west by the Normanby and Eston highway,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

Suez Canal—Provisional Regulations for Navigation at Night.

THE Suez Canal Company has published the following provisional regulations, for the navigation of a portion of the Suez Canal at night:—

ART. I. From the 1st December, 1885, and until further regulations are made, vessels of war

and mail steamers are allowed to go through the canal at night between Port Saïd and kilometre 54 (a distance of $29\frac{1}{2}$ miles), on the same conditions as those established for the day navigation, subject to the following arrangements :—

ART. II. Vessels of war and mail steamers intending to proceed at night from Port Saïd to kilometre 54, or vice versâ, must give information at Port Saïd, at Ismaïlia, or at Port Tewfik (Suez), through the Agents of the Company, that they are furnished with the following apparatus :—

1. Forward. An electric projector light, with a range of 1,300 yards.

2. Aft. An electric light capable of illuminating a circular area of 200 to 300 yards in diameter.

3. On each side. An electric light with reflector.

ART. III. If a vessel navigating at night receives the order to stop and make fast, she should directly this is effected, extinguish all her electric lights, keeping alight, exclusively, the night signals ordered for vessels secured to the bank, namely :—Foreward and aft, a white light. Look-outs must also be placed. On the approach of tugs, steam launches, lighters, &c., or of a vessel authorised to pass them, they must indicate the side on which the passage is clear by showing on that side of the vessel two white lights.

ART. IV. When two or more vessels, furnished with an electric apparatus, proceed at night in the same direction—the vessel, which may have to stop, should hoist immediately a red light at the mizen masthead, and give three short blasts of the steam vessel in quick succession, which should be repeated several times at short intervals, until the vessel following has repeated the signal. These signals indicate that the vessel astern must immediately reduce speed, for stopping, should it be necessary.

ART. V. The dredgers working at night between Port Saïd and kilometre 54, will exhibit from the highest part of them a red light, when they are not secured on one side of the channel.

ART. VI. When a vessel navigating at night is at a distance of 3 miles from a dredger at work, she must signal her approach by firing three rockets in succession. The dredger will answer "observed" by one rocket.

When the dredger is drawn on one side, the red light at the top is replaced by a white light, and two white lights are shown from her netting on the channel side.

The dredgers lighted by electricity extinguish all their electric lights as soon as they are drawn on one side.

ART. VII. The signals from the passing stations or "gares" to vessels navigating at night are as follows :—

1. Reduce speed. Three red lights placed vertically.

2. Make fast at the "Gare." Two red lights placed vertically.

3. Proceed. One red light.

When these signals apply to vessels approaching from the northward, they are surmounted by a fixed white light, visible from a distance of 9 miles. But this white light is placed below the signal, when it applies to vessels approaching from the southward.
