## (SWINE-FEVER.)

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 19th day of December, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Each of the Areas described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

## SCHEDULE.

(1.) An Area at Oxford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Botley-road on the north, the Great Western Railway on the east, and the river Thames on the west and south to where it joins the railway.

(2.) An Area at Oxford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Thames on the north, the Great Western Railway on the east, the Abingdon-road on the west, and the step ground ditch on the south.

## THE TEMPORARY SWINE-FEVER COMPULSORY SLAUGHTER ORDER OF JANUARY, 1886.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 21st day of December, 1885.

## PRESENT:

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Compulsory Slaughter by Local Authority.*

1. Notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order of 1884, Swine-Fever Amendment, every Local Authority in England and Wales and Scotland shall within two days after the existence of the disease is known to them cause to be slaughtered—

(a.) All swine within their District that at any time during the month of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, are affected with swine-fever: and

(b.) All swine within their District being or having been at any time during the month of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the same pig-sty or shed or in contact with any swine affected with swine-fever.

*Compensation.*

2. The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for swine slaughtered under this Order:

(a.) Where the pig slaughtered was affected with swine-fever, the compensation shall be one half of its value immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed forty shillings:

(b.) In every other case the compensation shall be the value of the pig immediately before it was slaughtered, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed four pounds.

*Application of General Provisions.*

3. The provisions of Section 30 (*General provisions relative to slaughter and compensation*) of the Act of 1878, and of Article 128 (*Withholding of Compensation*) and Article 129 (*Ascertainment of Value for Compensation*) of The Animals Order of 1884, shall apply to the case of swine slaughtered under the provisions of this Order.

*Saving of Special Provisions.*
