THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburgh, reporting that the Official Gazette of the aoth November contains the following notification from the Medical Department:—

"The following quarantine measures, in substitution for all previously existing arrangements, were adopted on the 14th of the present month of November for the Russian Black Sea ports:—

"1. For all ships arriving from Spain (including Gibraltar), as also from Algeria, Tunis, and Sicily, a period of observation, from fourteen to seven days, is established, in accordance with the instructions confirmed by the Minister of the Interior, on the 12th September, 1884; at the same time the period of observation of fourteen days will include the time, up to ten days, passed by vessels in quarantine at Coustantinople, or on their voyage, when sufficient proof of their having been so quarantined shall be supplied.

"2. Vessels arriving with a clean bill of health from France, Italy (excepting Sicily), India, and Japan shall be subjected to strict medical inspection, with the consequences defined in the Quarantine Code (§§ 102, 104, 119, 120, and

130); and

"3. All other places shall be recognized at present as healthy, and to vessels arriving therefrom only the general measures of precaution specified in the Quarantine Code (§§ 97-100, and following), shall be applied."
