POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

REGULATIONS, DATED 17TH DECEMBER, 1885, MADE UNDER THE POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

WHEREAS the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, provides that, subject to the Post Office Regulations, the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, may, for the purpose of the transmission of small sums through the Post Office, authorize his officers, or any of them, to issue Orders (hereinafter referred to as Postal Orders) in the form set forth in the schedule to that Act, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions contained in the said Act.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880, the Postmaster-General is authorized, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to make Post Office Regulations relating to Money Orders, and to the

persons by or to whom Money Orders shall be paid, and to the times at which and the mode in which the same shall be paid.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1883, certain alterations in the form of Postal Orders, as set forth in the schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, are sanctioned, and the Postmaster-General is empowered, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to prescribe, by Post Office Regulations, further modifications of the form of Postal Orders, and the several amounts (not exceeding twenty shillings) of such Orders, and the sums of poundage (not exceeding two pence) to be taken in respect of such Orders, and it was, amongst other things, provided that, where an arrangement is made with the Government of any British Possession for the transmission of small sums through the Post Offices of the United Kingdom and such British Possession by means of Money Orders of a like character to those issued under the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, as amended by that Act, the said Act, as amended by that Act should, so far as is consistent with the tenor thereof and subject to the prescribed modifications, apply in like manner as if an Order, issued in pursuance of such arrangement, whether by an officer of the Post Office or of such British Possession was an Order under the said Act, as amended by that Act, and that such portions of the said Act as enact punishment should apply accordingly.

And whereas it is intended that, on and after the 1st day of January, 1886, the Postal Service of Gibraltar shall cease to be conducted by officers of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General.

And whereas an arrangement has been made with the Government of Gibraltar for the issue and payment in Gibraltar, and in the United Kingdom and Constantinople respectively, on and after the said 1st day of January, 1886, of Postal Orders in the form and subject to the Regulations hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir John James Robert Manners, G.C.B. (commonly called Lord John Manners), Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in pursuance of the said Acts, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order as follows:—

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1886, on and from which date the Regulations made by Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Com-

missioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated respectively the 28th day of January, 1884, the 5th day of July, 1884, the 17th day of July, 1884, the 12th day of December, 1884, and the 1st day of April, 1885, so far as they respectively affect the issue or payment of Postal Orders in Gibraltar are hereby repealed, without prejudice, nevertheless, to anything already done in pursuance thereof.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations Postal Orders issued at any Post Office in Gibraltar may be paid in the United Kingdom and Constantinople by any officer or person for the time being there authorized to pay Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom, and Postal Orders may be issued by any such last-mentioned officer or person for payment in Gibraltar.

3. Every Postal Order issued in Gibraltar, the United Kingdom, or Constantinople shall be in the form and of one of the amounts specified in the said Regulations, dated the 28th day of January, 1884, or any other Regulations for the time being in force with reference to Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom; and all provisions of the said Regulations shall apply to Orders issued in Gibraltar, the United Kingdom, and Constantinople under these Regulations so far as the nature of the case admits.

In witness whereof I, the said John James Robert Manners, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, have hereunto set my hand this seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, We, the Local Government Board, in consequence of the prevalence of Cholera in certain parts of Spain, made regulations with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags from that country, and declared that such regulations should be in force until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; and by a General Order dated the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, We declared that the said Regulations should be in force until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six:

Now therefore, by this Our Order, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on Us in this behalf, We hereby declare that the regulations contained in the first above-cited Order shall be in force until the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

(No. 233.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—ADRIATIC—EAST COAST.—PASMAN STRAIT.

Fixed Red Light on St. Caterina Islet.

THE Austrian Government has given notice, dated 26th November, 1885, that a light is now exhibited on the south-west extreme of St. Caterina Islet, Pasman Strait:—

The light is a fixed red light, visible through an arc of 203°, or between the bearings of S. 18½° E., through east, and N. 41½° W., the latter bearing leading one cable westward of Osteria Rock, situated 2 miles south-eastward of Zara Vecchia. It is elevated 38 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The light is shown from an iron support, 28 feet high, rising above the centre of a building adjoining the keeper's dwelling, which is of stone and one storied.

Position on Admiralty charts, lat. 43° 56' 00" N., long. 15° 25' 40" E.

[The bearings are magnetic, and are given from seaward. Variation 9½° Westerly in 1885.]
