**B**Y an Order made by his Lordship Mr. Justice Chitty in the above matters, dated the 19th day of December, 1885, on the petition of John Bailey, of No. 1, Elvaston-place, Kensington, in the county of Middlesex, Esq., a creditor of the above-named Company, it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the above-named Endolithic Company Limited be continued, but subject to the supervision of the Court, and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up might be adopted as the Judge should think fit; and the creditors, contributories, and Liquidators of the said Company, and all other persons interested, were to be at liberty to apply to the Judge at Chambers as there might be occasion.
