The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding "of benefices in plurality, and to make better " provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may "be expedient that two or more benefices which "have been heretofore united or which may be "hereafter united under the provisions of this "Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things enacted, "That when two or more benefices "shall have been united, or may be hereafter "united into one benefice, and with respect to " his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop " of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese "shall represent to the said Archbishop of the "Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice "shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said "Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances " of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall ap-"pear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before " certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as here-"inafter directed, cause, with respect to his own "diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, "and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or "near the principal outer door of the church " or in some public and conspicuous place in " each of the benefices forming part of the united "benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such " six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, " or their hands to the said Archbishop against "any such disunion; and if no sufficient cause " be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall " certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's " consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, " and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty "to issue an Order for separating such last-" mentioned benefice or benefices from such united " benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage "of the several patrons, if there be more than one " patron, and such Order shall be registered in the

" registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar " of such diocese, immediately on the receipt " thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, " and thereupon immediately if such united benefice "shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first " avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facte " dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or " benefices so proposed to be separated from such "united benefice, but in all other respects shall " remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward " such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be "and be deemed and taken to be a separate and " distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and pur-" poses whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may. " according to the terms of such Order present or " nominate thereto respectively, and so from time " to time upon each and every avoidance of the "same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years " before the passing of this Act shall be disunited "without the consent in writing of the patron or " patrons thereof."

And whereas it was also enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the consent of the patron or patrons of such benefices respectively (such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rentcharges, or other endowments or emoluments belonging to, or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice, to each of such benefices respectively, as to Her Majesty in Council should seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe land, tithes, rent-charges, or any part thereof, might not arise or accrue within the limits of the benefice to which the same should be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or might not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole united benefice.

And whereas on the thirteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wellsmade a representation to His Grace Edward White, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the words following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Edward White, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I Arthur Charles Lerd Bishop of Bath and Wells do hereby represent to Your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the united rectories of North Cheriton and Holton in the county of Somerset and my diocese of Bath and Wells by the separation of the said rectory of North Cheriton from the rectory of Holton may be made with advantage to the interest of religion.

"Witness my hand this thirteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-

dred and eighty-five.

" Arthur C. Bath and Wells."

And whereas on the twentieth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five the Lord Archbishop enquired into the circumstances of the case.

And whereas on the fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five Edward White, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, certified to Her Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

**To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the united rectories of North Cheriton and Holton in the county of Somerset having represented unto us that the disunion of the said united rectories by the separation of the rectory of North Cheriton from the rectory of Holton may be made with advantage to the interests of religion we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved and that the Reverend John Gatehouse Clerk of North Cheriton in the county of Somerset being the patron or person entitled to present to the said united rectories if the same were now vacant

consents to the proposed disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the reply thereto the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are

hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for separating the said rectory of North Cheriton from the said rectory of Holton and in accordance with the consent in writing of the patron above referred to we recommend that each benefice when disunited shall retain its own original endowments and empluments and bear its own charges and outgoings.

"As witness our hand this fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five. "Edw. Cantuar."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said united benefice consisting of the rectory of North Cheriton and the rectory of Holton shall be disunited by separating the said rectory of North Cheriton from the said rectory of Holton.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, to assign and attach to each of such benefices its own original endowments and emoluments, and to direct that each benefice shall bear its own-original charges and outgoings.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint George Battersca in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint George Battersea which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Andrew situate within the limits of such new parish as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew Battersea.'

"And with the like consent of the said Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of.' Rochester (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Andrew situate as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Thomas Lander the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint George Battersea shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance as aforesaid at the said church of Saint Andrew situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Thomas Lander: And provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew Battersea being :---

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint George Battersea in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester wherein the present incumbent of such new parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded upon the south-east partly by the new parish of All Saints South Lambeth and partly by the new parish of Christ Church Clapham both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Philip Battersea in the same county and diocese or in other words by the line of the South London Railway, upon part of the north-west by the consolidated chapelry of All Saints Battersea Park in the county and diocese aforesaid, or in other words by the line of the London and South-Western Railway, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the remaining part of the north-west and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of All Saints Battersea Park from the new parish of Saint George Battersea aforesaid at a point at the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the London Chatham and Dover Railway over the main line of the London and South-Western Railway aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named line of railway for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the same line of railway over Stewart's-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to a point at or near to its junction with Corunnaplace opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 53 Stewart's-road from the house and premises known as No. 55 Stewart's - road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of one and a halt chains or there-

abouts to its junction with the wall or fence which divides some of the houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of Saint George'sroad from some of the houses and premises situate on the north-western side of Corunna-road and continuing thence still north-eastward along, the last-described wall or fence for a distance of three and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 45, Patmore-street from the house and premises known as No. 44 Patmore-street and continuing thence still northeastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its northeastern end on the south-western side of Patmorestreet aforesaid and continuing thence still northeastward and in a direct line across the last-named street to a point at the south-western end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises situate on the north-eastern side of the said street and called or known as 'the Royal Oak 'otherwise No. 1 Patmore-street and the house and premises situate on the south-eastern side of Saint George'sroad aforesaid and known as No. 20 Saint George's-road from the house and premises situate on the north-eastern side of Patmore-street aforesaid and known as No. 2 Patmore-street and continuing thence that is from the last-described. point still north-eastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence which divides other houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of Saint George's-road from other houses and premises situate on the north-western side of Corumaroad aforesaid and continuing thence still northeastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 107 New-road from the house and premises known as No. 105 New-road and continuing thence still north-eastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of one and a half chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end on the south-western side of New-road aforesaid and continuing thence still north-eastward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the last-named road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the same road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Saint George'sroad aforesaid and with Sussex-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to a point at its present north-eastern end upon the wall or fence which forms the present boundary of the land belonging to and in the occupation of the London and South-Western Railway Company and extending thence first castward and then alternately southwestward south - eastward and north - eastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts (thereby passing at the backs of the houses situate on the south-eastern side of Sussex-street aforesaid at the backs of most of the houses situate on the north-eastern-side of New-road aforesaid at the backs of the houses situate on the north-westerns. side of William-street and finally passing along the north-eastern ends of the last-named street and of John-street) to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint George Battersea from the new parish of All Saints South Lambeth aforesaid:"

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, there-

fore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the Kondon Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Coppenhall which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Crewe as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Crewe.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Crewe as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Paul Coppenhall in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester which is bounded upon the east, upon the south-east, and upon part of the south by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul Coppenhall from the parish of Coppenhall, in the county and diocese aforesaid crosses the middle of Fordlane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of ten and a-quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with West-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said street for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lincoln-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of six and three-quarter chains or thereabouts to its present southern end and continuing thence in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of five and three-quarter chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along the proposed continuation of the said Lincoln-street) to the point where the same street is intended to join Richard Moon-street and extending thence in a direction nearly due south-west and in a straight line for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the workshops and premises of the London and North-Western Railway Company, and also crossing the Chester and Crewe Line of the same Railway Company) to the centre of the bridge over the railway siding which connects the said line of railway with the gasworks belonging to the said Railway Company (which said bridge is intended to carry the proposed continuation of Wistaston New-road over the said railway siding) and extending thence that is from the centre of the said bridge in a direction due south and in a straight line for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Wistaston Brook and extending thence generally westward along the middle of the said brook for a distance of twenty-four and n-half chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul Coppenhall from the parish of Wistaston in the county and diocese aforesaid. All which said hereinhefore-described part of the new parish of Saint Paul Coppenhall aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the east, upon the south-east, and upon the part of the south asaforesaid that is to say upon the remaining part of the south upon the west and upon the north asfollows upon the remaining part of the south by the parish of Wistaston aforesaid upon the west by the parish of Nantwich in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the north partly by the new parish of

Saint Peter, Leighton-with-Minshull-Vernon in the same county and diocese and partly by the parish of Coppenhall aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of C. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir W Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to amend the laws concerning the burial of "the dead in England beyond the limits of the "Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning "the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications, viz.:-

KIRTON. - Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Kirton, near Boston, in the county of Lincoln; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, except as follows:-

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly

cemented :-

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth:-

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing cosins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations interred therein at the date of the Order as can be

buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into onsideration by a Committee of the Lords of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-

Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the tenth day of February next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said tenth day of February.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enucted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Act, recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the parish churchyard of Cavendish, in the county of Suffolk, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

In the parish churchyard of Barking, in the county of Essex, to the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

In the parish churchyard of Stanwix, in the county of Cumberland, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by Her Order in Council of the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight 'hundred and eighty-five, to direct the discontinuance of burials, with certain exceptions, in the church and churchyard of New Shoreham, in the county of Sussex, and whereas it seems fit that the operation of such Order should be suspended until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and that the provisions of the Order in Council of the twentyeighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, as affecting burials in the said church and churchyard should again be in force until the thirtieth June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.
