An Area round Crastock Farm, in the parish of Woking, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point in Berry-lane where a foot-path to the main Guildford and Knaphillroad leaves the lane, thence by such foot-path to its junction with such main-road, thence by an imaginary line to Sanders-lane, thence by Sanderslane to its junction with Berry-lane aforesaid, thence across Berry-lane and by the foot-path to Ellis Place Farm, thence by the south boundary fences of the fields numbered 1214 and 1213 on the 25 inch ordnance map to Berry-lane aforesaid, and thence by such lane in an easterly direction till the footpath leading to the main Guildford and Knaphill-road is again reached.

(No. 1.)-WHITE SEA.-GULF OF ONEGA.

Shoals Eastward of Vek Point.

INFORMATION has been received from the Russian Government of the existence of the three undermentioned shoals lying eastward of Vek Point, western shore of the Gulf of Onega:-

(1.) A shoal, nearly awash at low water, lies with Vck Point bearing W. 1 S., distant 31 miles. Position, lat. 64° 37' 00" N., long. 35° 9' 15" E.

(2.) A shoal, with about two feet on it at low water, lies with Vek Point bearing W. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. distant three miles, and shoal (1) N.E. by N., $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

(3.) A shoal, with a depth of about six feet at low water, lies with Vek Point bearing N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles, and shoal (2) N.E. by E., five cables.

Note.-The shoals (2) and (3) are now marked by beacons on their southern sides. It is considered that the British steam-vessel "Perseverance" struck on or near one of these shoals in August, 1885.

The bearings are magnetic. Variation, $4\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ Easterly in 1885.]

Batavia—Time Signal at Tanjong Priok.

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, that on 10th November, 1885, the following time signals would be established at Tanjong Prick (new Harbour of Batavia).

The signal consists of four circular discs, placed on an iron support, near the entrance of the inner basin ; the signal is made once daily, Sundays and fête days excepted, as follows :-

(1.) Outer Eider Light-Vessel-Provisional Fog Signal.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 93, of 16th May, 1885, on temporary alteration in the fog-signal on board Outer Eider Lightvessel.

The German Government has given further notice, dated 12th December, 1885, that should the siren, worked by a caloric engine, be out of order, the fog signal from the light-vessel will be a powerful bell, sounded for a period of two minutes every ten minutes.

Note.---When signals are heard from vessels, the bell-signal is repeated every five minutes.

(2.) Temporary Withdrawal of Inner Eider Light-Vessel.

Also, has given notice, that Inner Eider Lightvessel will be temporarily withdrawn from her station during the winter for repairs, probably from 15th December, 1885. Of the withdrawal further information will be given.

Particulars of Keats Bank.

THE following information relating to a shoal (Keats Bank), situated eastward of the Marshall Islands, is re-published from the log-book of Captain Kcats :--

Soundings of thirteen fathoms were found in lat. 5° 57' N., long: 173° 37' E., and the bottom was distinctly seen ; keeping the same course for half an-hour the soundings gave five fathoms, when the ship was tacked to the north-eastward, and the shoul almost immediately cleared.

The position assigned to the shoal, from good observations by Captain Keats, is in lat. 5° 55" N., long. 173° 38' E.

This shoal was originally placed on the Admiralty Chart in 1873, and nothing concerning it having since been received, is still retained, and in the above position, on the charts.

THE Belgian Government has given notice, dated 6th December, 1885, that the following

provisional signals are established on board West Hinder, Wandelnar, and Wielingen Lightvessels :-

West Hinder Light-vessel.-Should the revolving apparatus of the light of this vessel be out of order, it will be replaced by two fixed lights placed vertically, the upper light red, the lower light white; a flare white light will also be shown every ten minutes. Should the light-vessel drift from her station, the revolving light and the anchor light will be replaced by three fixed lights placed vertically, the middle light being red and the other two white; by day, in this case, a red flag will be hoisted at the mainmast head.

Wandelaar Light-vessel.-Should this vessel drift from her station, a red flag will be hoisted at the mainmast head during the day.

Wielingen Light-vessel .- During thick and foggy weather a bell will be sounded continuously on board this vessel.

NOTE.-Should the light-vessels require assistance, they will show, in addition to the distinguishing and anchor lights, a white light at the taffrail, and a red rocket will be fired every fifteen minutes. During the day, the signal flags N.C. of the International Code will be hoisted.

(No. 7.)-South Pacific Ocean-Friendly ISLANDS.

Volcanic Island Southword of Culebras Reef.

THE United States Government has given notice, that the Captain of the stcam-vessel "Janet Nicoll" reports the submarine volcano southward of Culebras Reef having become active, and formed an island about 2 miles long in a north and south direction, and about 250 feet in height.

A reef extends off the southern end of the island for a distance of $1\frac{1}{3}$ miles, and off the northern end for half a mile.

Approximate position as given, lat. 20° 28' S., long. 175° 21' W. Nore.—The position above given agrees closely

with that of the submarine volcano reported in 1877, about 6 miles northward of Honga-Tonga Island.
