THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that the Ottoman Board of Health has decided to subject to a quarantine of observation of forty-eight hours in ports where there is a Medical Health Officer, arrivals from Venice and its neighbourhood, which had taken their departure since the 31st ultimo. By a subsequent decision, arrivals from the same district which took their departure after the 4th instant, are to be subjected to five full days observation.
