By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing. Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve c'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of the Holy Trinity, situate within the limits of the ancient chapelry of Seathwaite aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Harvey, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Kirkby Ireleth which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the

map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of the ancient chapelry of Seathwaite as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District

Chapelry of Seathwaite.'

"And with the like consent of the said Harvey, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of the Holy Trinity, situate within the limits of the ancient chapelry of Seathwaite as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of

baptism or for the registration thereof.
"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in

Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Seathwaite, be-

"All that the northern part of the parish of Kirkby Ireleth, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Carlisle (comprising the ancient chapelry of Seathwaite) which is co-extensive with the limits of that portion of the township of Dunnerdale-cum-Seathwaite which is bounded upon the south and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said county of Lancaster from the county of Cumberland at the centre of Ulpha Bridge which carries the road leading from the Kirkhouse to Whistleton Green over the River Duddon and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of the said road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the culvert which carries the same road over Birk's Beck and extending thence eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to the summit of Stickle Pike and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one mile and a half or thereabouts to the summit of Mount Caw and continuing thence north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one mile and one third of a mile or thereabouts to the summit of White Pike and continuing thence still north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one-third of a mile or thereabouts to the highest point at the southern end of Walney Scar, the last-mentioned point being upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kirkby Ireleth from the parochial chapelry and rectory of Torver in the parish of Ulverston in the said county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Carlisle aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Kirkby Ireleth aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the south and the south-east as aforesaid that is to say upon the east upon the north and upon the west as follows upon the east partly by the said parochial chapelry and rectory of Torver
